Spiritual Help For Alcoholics Urged By Priest

Efforts of Alcoholics Anonymous and other groups have proved that "the spirituality of men may be so aroused as to be productive of untold good," the Rev. Eugene N. Golding declared Tuesday at a session of the Second Annual Institute of the Rochester Committee for Education on Alcoholism.

Speaking at a panel on "The Problem—The Cost—The Remedy," Father Golding, chaplain at Rochester State Hospital and Holy Spiritum, praised the AA for "impressing a man with his need for a supernatural assistance and urging him to pray. It demonstrates," he added, "that alcoholics can find a marvelous friendship in the brotherhood of man under the Fatherhood of God."

Urging a new type of approach to the alcoholic, Judge Arthur L. Wilder of City Court told the institute that imprisonment is not a solution of a problem that is costing hundreds of thousands of dollars a year in Rochester and Monroe County alone.

Several Catholic organizations are among the sponsors of the Rochester Committee and the annual institute, which was held in the Chamber of Commerce building.


