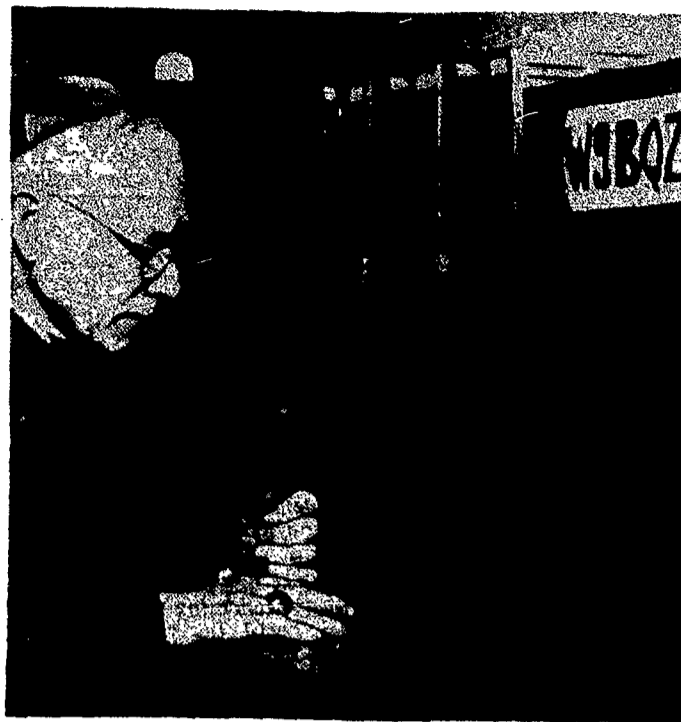

Spain Reviews Banned Movie

Madrid—(NC) — Eric A. Johnston, president of the Motion Picture Association of America, has discussed the banning of the film "Gentleman's Agreement" with Bishop Leopold Eljo y Garay of Madrid, Alcala and Spain's Foreign Minister Alberto Martin Ariza.

It is understood that the film will be reviewed by the motion picture board and that its showing in Spain after certain alterations have been made.

BOTH Bishop Eljo and the Foreign Minister emphasized again that no racial problem of any kind exists in Spain, that any assertions to that effect are wholly unfounded and that, therefore, the original decision to bar the film could in no way be attributed to such racial motives.

A previous statement issued by the Spanish Embassy in Washington charged that the original press report of the banning of the film "misconstrues the facts" and added: "The basic grounds on which the cinematographic board substantiated its unanimous decision are that the film gives rise to the controversial racial questions of-Semitism and anti-Semitism. This problem does not exist in Spain and in no way should be provoked."

Nun On Nurses Committee New Orleans (NC) — Sister Celestine, administrator of Hotel Dieu here since July, 1946 has been appointed a member of the committee for administration of the accrediting program of the National League of Nursing Education. Membership of the committee comprises 14 of the outstanding nurse educators in the United States.
