**Sons To Mark Prof. Bonn Anniversary At Mass**

Hundredth anniversary of the birth of Prof. F. Eugene Bonn, for nearly a half century a leader in church music activities in the Rochester diocese, occurs next Sunday.

At the 11 o'clock Mass Sunday at St. Peter and Paul's Church, Rochester, where Prof. Bonn's son John Paul Bonn, is organist, all the part music will be from the compositions of late Prof. Bonn.

Prof. Bonn was born in Bavaria, Germany, Oct. 31, 1848 and came to Rochester in the fall of 1888 at the request of Bishop McQuaid to become organist and choirmaster at St. Patrick's Cathedral, a position he held for 47 years. He was active until some four weeks before his death on March 5, 1935.

He was always an active supporter of truly ecclesiastical music for all church services. He organized one of the first boys' choirs in the Rochester Catholic diocese. He wrote numerous compositions for church use, several organ and piano works, secular songs, and choruses.

THE DEDICATIONS of his church compositions sketch the early days of the Rochester diocese. They mention Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid, Bishop Thomas F. Hickey, Bishop J. Francis O'Hern, St. Bernard's Seminary, and Archbishop Edward Hanna of St. Francisco, who was consecrated in the old Rochester Cathedral.

In addition to his work at the Cathedral, Prof. Bonn taught music at St. Bernard's Seminary in its early days and for nearly 35 years in St. Andrew's Seminary. On Mar. 23, 1930 he received

Mr. Gauhn, a native of Rochester was graduated from old Cathedral Grammar School and received his education in other schools in the city. After long service in the City Health Department, he was made chief of inspector for the Monroe County Department of Sanitation. He was the first chairman of the State Youth Commission appointed in the state.

He was a member of Rochester Fourth Degree Assembly, Knights of Columbus and of Rochester Council and had been active in lay circles for many years.

Surviving are his son, Emmett W. Gauhn and a sister, Miss Gertrude A. Gauhn, both of Rochester.
