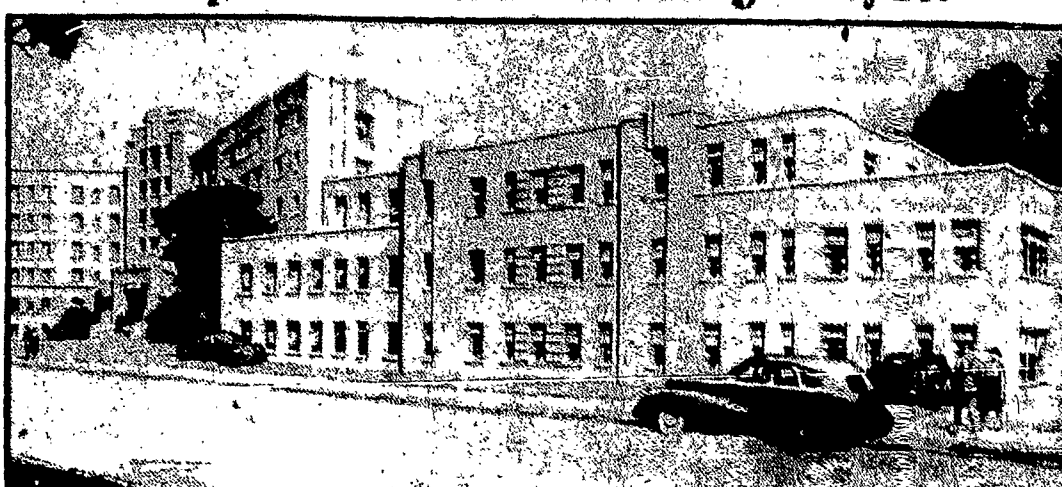
New Outpatient Department For St. Mary's Planned As Rochester Hospital Fund Financing Project

Approval of plans for a new outpatient department at St. Mary's Hospital was announced this week by Daniel J. Meagher, chairman of the hospital's building committee. The project is one of those being financed by the \$6,940,000 hospital building fund program sponsored by the Rochester Hospital Fund.

The new department will house 27 modern, well-equipped clinics and will replace the present outpatient department where limited and outdated facilities have long been serious handicaps. Services in many specialized fields of medicine will be available, and new laboratory and other diagnostic facilities will permit increased emphasis on early discovery and treatment of disease.

Joseph P. Flynn, architect of the hospital designed the new plant. In commenting upon approval of the plans, the Hon. William F. Love, chairman of the men's advisory board of St. Mary's stressed the fact that the new unit would help to relieve congestion in all of the hospitals throughout the city.

"A modern outpatient department such as the one planned

for St. Mary's," he said, "can substantially reduce the need for hospital bed care. Patients seen early in the course of disease can be treated and cured before their condition becomes serious

enough to require their admission as bed patients. "With its emphasis on early diagnosis and treatment as well as on preventive care for mothers and children," Judge Love

added, "the new outpatient department at St. Mary's will form a strong link in the community-wide chain of better health defenses which the fund's program contemplates."

speaker asserted. "If Catholics were as keenly loyal to fellow Catholics as other people are to their own."

While stressing spiritual needs in answering the question, "Will Europe Be Saved?" Lunn dwelt at length on political aspects of various European nations through which he has traveled. In his opinion Russia will overrun Europe within the next two years or not at all.

"I'd like to see a German Army (but no Air Force) of about 30 divisions to fill that vacuum in Western Germany," he declared. "The present situation cannot be prolonged indefinitely."

Despite the recent election results in Italy, Lunn said, the large numbers of Communists there present "a serious situation." He predicted that "De Gaulle will come back" in France. Describing Spain as "a bulwark" against Communism, Lunn said there is no reason why, with Russia a member of the United Nations, Spain should be excluded. It is barred now, he added, "only as a matter of expediency."
