Congress Revue To Bring Out Youth Talent

Fervid activity marks the planning committee for the entertainment program highlighted in the Diocesan Congress of Nov. 11 at the Columbus Civic Center. Queenssteens Revue will spotlight talent from seven diocesan high schools and the Parish Union Sodality, including a cast of 150 boys and girls.

Reports from the entertainment steering committee under the chairmanship of Rev. E. Charles Bauer of Holy Family Parish indicate that enthusiasm among the participants is keen. Planned on a competitive basis, the revue promises to be a major attraction for out-of-town delegates to the Congress who will be the guests for two nights in the honors of Rochester Sodality.

INCLUDED in the program are both dramatic and musical sketches. Aquinas Institute Band led by Mr. Ray Hansen, will furnish an overture and finale for the evening's entertainment. Between each number they will also provide musical interludes. Holy Family High in Auburn has prepared a musical skit entitled "An Evening at Home." A Maroon and White Minstrelletoe planned by students of Aquinas Institute promises to be a real challenge to other competitors.

Students of St. Agnes High and Nazareth Academy will render a musical program featuring choral and voice culture groups. A vocal duet will introduce the dramatic sketch planned by Our Lady of Mercy High School, while music for the Parish Union's presentation will take the form of a choral dance, "Waltz of the Flowers."

The Queenssteens winners of the Revue will be determined by means of an applause meter.

The Marian Mixer, a gala open house to feature Syl Novelli's Orchestra on the Wednesday evening preceding the convention, will inaugurate the social life of the congress and background the hospitality center under the direction of Jack Scharr of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish and Jean Schreiner of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Charles McCarthy of the music department at St. Andrew's Seminary, except for the proper and the supplementary offertory which will be rendered by the Seminary's choir from St. Andrew's.

General sessions, group forums and discussions will be led by such youth leaders as Rev. J. Roger Lyons, S.J., Rev. Richard Rooney, S.J., and Miss Dorothy Willmann. Evening meetings will be slated for all lay leaders of parish organizations.

Father Lyons, S.J., associate director of Catholic Action Summer Schools, Miss Willmann, authority on parish sodality organization and Father Rooney, popular retreat master for young people, all from the Sodality head quarters in St. Louis, have planned an extensive educational program in lay leadership.
