

Plant Started At Elmira Hospital

(Continued from Page 7) by making it impossible to be started while being loaded or unloaded. When operating at full capacity, the two machines will wash 965 lbs. of clothes per hour, or the equivalent of approximately 640 large sheets.

The latest design of water softener will be used to provide very soft water at the proper temperature. This is accomplished by running the water through a brine tank into another tank containing zeolite process water softener, and from there through a series of heated pipes to the washers.

THE EXTRACTOR designed to remove surplus water from washed laundry has removable metal containers loaded directly from the washers, and then lifted from the floor by an electric hoist. After the surplus water has been removed, the hoist lowers the containers, where the extracted load is emptied mechanically. This entire process is accomplished by operating a push button.

After extraction, sheets, pillow cases, bed spreads and similar types of flat linens are ready to be ironed on the flat work ironer. This eight roll ironer is equipped with spring padding under asbestos cloth. This padding has a new vacuum feature whereby moisture is drawn out of the padding by suction, as the clothes advance through the rollers. This hastens the drying process to a great extent.

As the sheets, pillow cases, hand towels and other flat articles are ironed, they are folded and placed on trays. The trays proceed by an automatic gravity conveyor to the linen distribution room. Here the linen is removed from the trays, and the trays are automatically returned to the flat work ironer.

DOCTORS' AND Nurses' uniforms and other articles of clothing are ironed on presses. These new type presses satisfactorily complete the ironing process, so that no hand ironing is necessary. Spray guns installed above the presses provide for any dampening of clothes required before ironing.

Following the extraction process, some goods as bath towels, wash clothes and other articles which do not require ironing are transferred to the drying tumblers which complete the drying process in a quick uniform manner.

The new construction will include space for storage of linens, a sewing room for the repair of linen, and a linen distributing room. From this central point, it is planned to dispense linen directly to the patient's room as well as to the various departments of the hospital. Covered passage ways will provide for convenience and efficiency in transporting linen to and from all divisions of the hospital in all kinds of weather.
