Missionary Bishop Greet Diocese Over 'Ham' Radio

Prairie Du Chien, Wis. — (NC) — The newly-consecrated Bishop of Belize, British Honduras, spoke his first episcopal words of greeting to members of his flock from here through a "ham" radio station operated by a Jesuit father at Campion High School.

From the microphone of Station W9BQZ, the Most Rev. David F. Hickey, S. J., spoke to two priests at Belize, opening with: "God bless all of you, priests, Sisters, people." The Rev. Robert J. Conroy, S. J., operator of the station, arranged the broadcast.

IN BELIZE Station W9IAP, operated by Armando Perez, another amateur broadcaster, received the Bishop's message. The Rev. Very Rev. John M. Knopp, S. J., Superior of the Belize Mission, and the Rev. Gregory B. Sontag, S. J., reported to the new Bishop over the Belize station that the people were planning an elaborate welcome for him.

THE GREATEST STORY Ever Told dramatizes "The Pursued", a fast moving story of Biblical times, on WARC (950) this Sunday evening at 6:30 p.m. Terror-stricken and unarmed the hero confronts his would-be assassin in a tiny village of Galilee 2,000 years ago.

THE STORY OF FATIMA, told so reverently and enjoyed so widely in the Rochester area of WSAY, will become "The Story of Lourdes" beginning this Sunday evening on WSAY at 7:30 p.m. The Rev. Joseph Cirrincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church who for more than 15 months has spoken each Sunday evening on the miraculous events of the apparitions at Fatima, opens a new series of broadcasts Nov. 7 in which he will recount the message of Lourdes as "Act II of the Story of Fatima".

A New children's program for Sunday-afternoon-listening begins this weekend on WSAY from 5:30 to 6 o'clock when Father Joseph Cirrincione presents a transcription of a weekly story-hour held for little girls at his Parish Center. Designed for youngsters, the program will be a recording of the actual reading of "The Children of Fatima" by Mary Fabian Windtall to a group of children whose comments and accompanying hymns will make a novel frame for the retelling of the events of Fatima for a child's understanding.

SERMON TOPICS for next week's daily Sacred Heart Program as listed by WRNY are: Sunday, Nov. 7, The Universal World; Monday — Prayer as a Power; Tuesday — Intentions; Wednesday — The Third Degree; Thursday — Joy of Good Science; Friday — Friendship of Jesus; Friday over WRNY each weekday at 12:15 p.m. and each Sunday morning at 8:45 a.m. The Sacred Heart Program offers a six minute sermon by a different Jesuit Father each day, a few short daily prayers and religious music.

SECOND SPEAKER for the new Elmira Catholic Hour each Sunday on Elmira station WENY (1230) will be the Rev. Leo G. Schwab pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church. The weekly 15 minute program will feature talks by all the clergy of the Elmira area with the general aim of presenting the Catholic position on vital moral and dogmatic issues of the day.

Japanese Mission Reports 1,600 Studying for Baptism

Kyoto, Japan. There are as many Japanese preparing for baptism here today as there were Christians in the entire Kyoto Maryknoll mission a year ago.

At the beginning of 1947 there were only 1,599 Catholics in the entire territory. There was an increase of 768 baptisms in 1948 which brought the Catholic population up to 2,367.

There are 1,600 persons now being instructed in preparation for baptism, a number which could easily be increased if there were additional priests available to teach the many Japanese, whose catechumens must be postponed.

Wilfrid Meynell Death Reported

London (NC). Wilfrid Meynell, a convert to the Church at 18 and perhaps the leading British Catholic literary figure for over 50 years, died last week at his home at Pulborough, Sussex, at the age of 95.

His greatest service to world literature was his discovery of Francis Thompson, at the time a starving poet who submitted his first poem on blue sugar paper. Mr. Meynell thereupon hunted London for him for months. After finally contacting him he became the poet's closest friend and aided his climb to fame.

Mr. Meynell, editor, story teller, poet and assaiist, was happily married for 45 years to Alice Meynell, British Catholic writer who died in 1922. He became managing director of Burns and Oates, publishers and was the father of nine children, the youngest of whom, Sir Francis Meynell, himself is a poet and publisher.

Born in 1852 of a non-Catholic family that had lived many generations in England's northeastern plain north of York, Mr. Meynell entered the Catholic Church in 1870 and was for the rest of his life above all else a devout Catholic. Educated in York, he married in 1877.

College Plains Observatory Edmundson, N. B. (NC) — An unusual feature of a new St. Louis college being built in this border town for the Eudist Order, will be a tower housing an observatory and classrooms for astronomy, said to be the first in the maritime provinces. The tower will be two stories above the five floors and basement of the main building. Astronomy will be given special attention in the college curriculum.
