Pupils Work Acclaimed In Hornell School Exhibit

Hornell - Exhibits ranging from simple printing and color pictures to copies of intricate Gothic and Byzantine architecture attracted more than 200 parents and friends of pupils to St. Ann's School, last Friday.

The work of the pupils was shown at the annual Parents Night sponsored by the Mothers Club.

Mrs. J. F. Baird and Mrs. B. J. Wright were co-chairmen under the supervision of the Sisters of Mercy, who comprise the faculty.

In the primary department, printing, color books and farm animal cutouts and a blackboard mural depicting a circus parade were outstanding in originality and neatness. An entire corner of the second grade room was devoted to a display of regulation traffic signals and road signs for practical study in the field of safety.

FEATURED in the Alaskan exhibit of the fourth grade were tiny models of Eskimos, dog teams, and igloos. Clay replicas of a rubber plantation in the Amazon Valley were outstanding in the display of the sixth grade. On display were clay and water color models of the map of South America as well as project maps. Also shown were pictures of ancient Greek architecture being studied by the grade.

Progress in transportation was effectively depicted in the fifth grade exhibit. The advance in means of travel and communication from the time of the American Indian to the present day was shown in large colored posters. In the practical arts department was a display of door stops and paper weights made from gaily painted stones. Skillful blending of color and design was evident in the chalk drawings of the seventh grade pupils picturing life of the Indians.

AMONG THE outstanding exhibits of the eighth grade were a hobby display including stamp collections, money collection, old china, miniatures, costume jewelry and a model altar. In the social studies display, drawings of inventions and American progress were shown as well as ancient church architecture. Artistic talent was highlighted by a drawing of the Empire State Building done in blue and silver. Throughout the school, during the month of October special art work reflected the tribute being paid the Blessed Virgin Mary.
