Chicago Next Aquinas Foe; Smash Texas Trickery, 22-6

Mt. Carmel High, a 1200-student boys' school in Chicago, sends its football caravan to Rochester's Red Wing Stadium this Sunday to face unbeaten, untied Aquinas Institute.

Rated by Aquinas scouts as well-conditioned, heavy and smart, the Carmelites boast a record of seven wins and two defeats this year.

Although beaten 137 in a surprising upset by Weber High and heavy defense power, the visitors claim a heavier backfield than Aquinas and a quarterback who is the equal of Rochester's "Chuckling Charley" Maloy in throwing passes to his rangy ends. The line averages 189 lbs. to meet the Aquinas 201 lb. average.

Star of the Carmelites is Captain Vince Meschke, 6' 3", 220 lb. right end, stellar pass-receiver and heavy defensive power. He also does the placekicking and is the team's field general. His mate, Ed Blerne, 6', 189 lbs. is lightning fast and a slashing defensive player.

Quarterback Joe Gibbons, called "Chicago's finest high school passer" has a 600 average for pass-completions and is an excellent ballhandler for the Carmel High reserve plays.

ST. THOMAS High School of the Basilian Fathers from Houston, Texas, gave 17,209 fans a puzzling display of deception and speed last Sunday before they fell as sixth victims of the Aquinas unbeatables, 22 to 0.

Second string quarterback, Tom Anderson, playing his first game for the Houston school, was the finest performer on the field. His ballhandling deceptions fooled the fans and the Aquinas line so completely that the visitors threatened the Irish goal line three times but lost the ball on downs or interceptions.

One touchdown, earned after a drive of 40 yards, was disqualified by a freak penalty called on the Texans for having 12 men on the field. Their sole score was an intercepted pass and 35 yard run in the closing moments of the first half.

AQUINAS scored first after a 38 yard ground drive sparked by dashes of Charley Elbert and Al Catalano. Charley Maloy's spot passing set up the next touchdowns when he threw 40 yards to Johnny Della Villa for the score and made a 37 yard pass to Frank Trubitt which Della Villa and Hilbert quickly

ran over the line for the third T. D.

Tackle Francis Holahan scored a 2 point safety for Aquinas by trapping Houston quarterback Anderson trying to pass from behind his own goal line.

Game statistics prove that the "Houston Houdinis" snatched Aquinas will. St. Thomas had 10 first downs to the Irish 12, but gained only 84 yards on the ground to the Rochester's 177 yards. In the passing department, Maloy made 60 yards in nine attempts while Houston made 59 yards by air for 11 passes.
