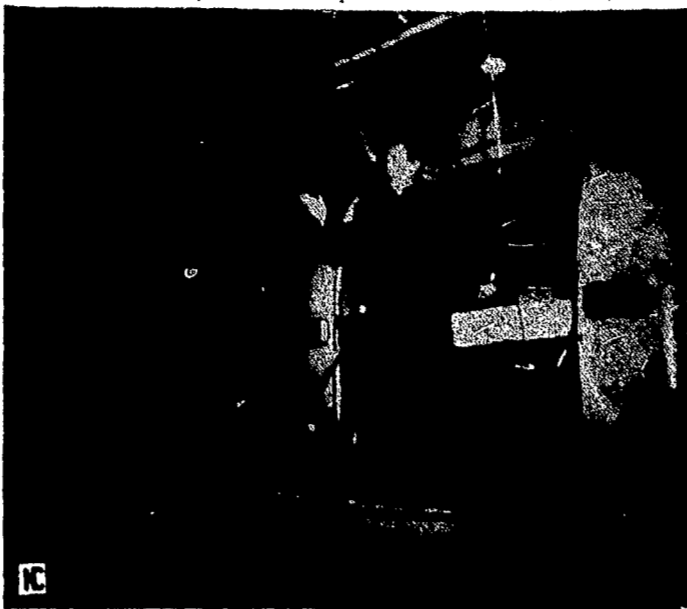


Movie Premiere Aids Catholic Drama Meet

Statue of Father Flanagan Planned for Boys Town Site

Boys Town, Neb. — (NC) — A memorial statue as a tribute to the late Msgr. Edward J. Flanagan will be presented to Boys Town, which he founded and directed, by the Variety Clubs International, and will be unveiled at ceremonies on November 28. It has been announced by Msgr. Nicholas H. Wegner, who succeeded Father Flanagan as director of the institution.

WORD OF the presentation was received from R. J. O'Donnell, chief banker of the Variety Clubs International and John H. Harris of Pittsburgh, Variety Club founder.

The statue, which is in Bedford stone, depicts Father Flanagan with four of his boys, and is the work of Eugene Kaufmann, world famous sculptor of Burlington, who is in residence at the University of Notre Dame.

FATHER FLANAGAN had a final sitting for the statue last January when he stopped off at the university while enroute to Europe on a welfare mission for the War Department. He died in Berlin last May 15 while on the mission.

The statue, which is seven and a half feet tall and will be mounted on a six by three foot base will be erected at the end of a parkway, Edward Snafon, Omaha attorney and member of the Omaha Variety club, has been named chairman of arrangements for the unveiling ceremony. A large delegation of Variety Club members, headed by Mr. O'Donnell and Mr. Harris, will attend the ceremonies.

Father Flanagan was named recipient of the first annual award presented by Variety Clubs International in 1938 and for many years was associated with Variety Clubs International affairs.
