China Missioner Asks Aid For His Family In Italy

An appeal in behalf of his impoverished family in Italy has been made by the Rev. F. Venantius Longo, O.F.M., a Franciscan missionary priest, Propagation of the Faith.

Father Longo, a cousin of Sister Mary Dominica, of the Sisters of Mercy at St. John's convent, Clyde, disclosed the plight of his family in a letter to the Very Rev. Msgr. John S. Randall, Propagation of the Faith director.

Returning to Italy after seventeen years in the communist zone of China, the Franciscan found that his aging parents were left without steady support by the death of two sons in the war, and constant unemployment of another. About to return to his missionary duties in China torn by communist-led strife, Father Longo expressed the hope that he may be able to assure his family of relief before his departure.

FATHER LONGO left Italy in 1931 and began his missionary labors in North China in the Shanai Province. Ordained in 1936, he was sent to Wutai district which became a communist war zone the following year. He was jailed and forbidden all missionary duties, which he was only able to resume in 1938.

Regional Meeting Calls 'Verein' Units To Buffalo

Thirty-five members of the Rochester Branches, Catholic Central Union (Verein) of America and National Catholic Women's Union, attended the Regional Conference of the New York State Branches held at Buffalo Sunday, Nov. 21. The Conference was attended by members from Rochester, Syracuse, Buffalo, Albany, New York and Brooklyn.

In the men's session Richard Hermerlein of Syracuse explained the workings of the Central Bureau of the Central Verein. Albert Sattler of New York, president of the National Organization of the Central Verein, gave a summary of the accomplishments of the Central Verein during 1948. William Roeger of Rochester, and Carl Leisig of Buffalo reported for their respective branches on what has been done for German relief.

Mr. Roeger, as general chairman of the Convention Committee, reported on the preliminary plans made for the 1949 convention of the State Branch to be held in Rochester. He assured the meeting that Rochester would make the 1949 convention a memorable one.

JOSEPH H. GERVAIS of Rochester talked on Secularism. He reviewed the annual statements of the Bishops of the United States from November 1945, to November 1948, and stated that the discussion of these statements should be included in the program of each local branch. He pointed out the close parallel between the statements of the Bishops and the Resolutions of the Central Verein and said that this similarity was no accident; but rather a reflection of a stated policy of the Central Verein which was "to do all things in conformity with the spirit and mind of the Church."
