Groups Form To Fight Diseases
Formation of the Rochester Committee of the New York Chapter of the Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation to study and combat "the nation's number one crippling, rheumatic disease," was announced Tuesday.

Mrs. John H. Rae was elected chairman of the new organization at its charter meeting in the East Avenue headquarters of the Monroe County Medical Society.

Representatives of the public and of the medical profession organized the Committee. It is affiliated with the national Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation, which is seeking "to solve the problem of these afflictions which permanently cripple and deform so many people."

Eighteen lay persons and 14 physicians sponsored the local group, which will be assisted by a medical advisory committee to include at least one representative from each of the city's six hospitals, the University of Rochester Medical School, the City Health Bureau and the County Medical Society.
