Aquinas Stadium Promised For 1949 Football Season

Aquinas Institute will have its new Memorial Stadium for the opening game of the 1949 football season.
The Rev. Hugh Haffey, C.S.B., director of the Aquinas Memorial Stadium Campaign, made this definite announcement at Aquinas last evening when he told a large meeting of the Aquinas Men's Club that construction of the long-awaited stadium "will begin very shortly" on the 15-acre site at the corner of Mt. Read Blvd. and Ridge-way Avenue with "delivery guaranteed by August 15, 1949."
"The total seating capacity of the stadium will be over 20,000," he promised. "It will be of concrete and have a horse-shoe shape — substantially as presented to the public during the fund-raising campaign of 1945."
BIDS FOR THE construction work are now being submitted to the Aquinas authorities. Father Haffey declared, and the accepted contractor will be announced publicly December 8 at the annual Football Banquet in the Chamber of Commerce.
In three seasons of play under Coach Harry Wright, Aquinas football has grown to such "major-league" proportions that Littleton all over the country and the Irish opponents come from facilities at the Red Wing Stadium have often been inadequate for the overflow crowds. Guests of honor invited to salute the 1948 team will be the football coaches of a half-dozen leading Catholic colleges in the East. They will share speaking honors with His Excellency Bishop.
