Fr. Canali Dies
A Canon in Italy, Was Pastor Here

The Rev. Orestes Canali, a Canon of the Collegiate Church of Monte Carlo, Italy who served many years in Rochester diocese, died Nov. 4, 1948 in the Italian city in the Province of Lucca.
Officiating at the Solemn Mass of Requiem was Monsignor Proposto Micheli in the Monte Carlo Church. Burial was in that church's cemetery.
In the fall of 1906, Father Canali was appointed by Bishop Bernard J. McQuaid to establish the parish of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel and the first Mass of that parish was celebrated in Corpus Christi Hall.
Stationed at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Father Canali, a learned priest, taught at St. Andrew's Seminary for 9 years. He also served as pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas Church, Leicester and helped out at St. Felix Church, Clifton Springs.

Catholics Join In Effort To Curb Rheumatic Disease

Rochester and Monroe County residents will be given an opportunity next week to tackle a communitywide problem, rheumatic disease, under the urgent banner, "Conquer the Crippler!"
Approximately 330,000 will be sought in a solicitation effort from Monday, Dec. 6, through Saturday, Dec. 11, by the newly organized Arthritis and Rheumatism Foundation of Rochester. Half the funds received will be used locally to provide better diagnosis and treatment, and the remainder for research by the national foundation.
Both labor and management will benefit directly from this battle. Foundation officials assert. More than 97 million work days are lost each year because of arthritis and rheumatism—equal to an army of 320,000 unemployed persons otherwise employable.
Several prominent Catholic laymen are associated with the new Foundation, of which Martin Q. Gault is vice chairman. Miss Helen Guntert, executive secretary of the Monroe County Medical Society, was among organizers of the group.
Termining rheumatic disease as "one of the most neglected fields of medical science," Mrs. John H. Rae, local A & R Foundation chairman, pointed out that arthritis and rheumatism are more common than the number of cases of tuberculosis, diabetes, cancer and heart disease combined.
"The idea that rheumatism is a hopeless condition should be and can be combated," Mrs. Rae contended. "Opportunity to do this is afforded by the fact that a large proportion of patients can be saved from lifelong pain, and from becoming crippled. If they receive effective early diagnosis and treatment. That's our immediate goal here."
Thirty-two civic and medical representatives formed the local Foundation last week. It will be a medical advisory committee to include at least one representative from each of the city's six hospitals, the University of Rochester Medical School, the City Health Bureau and the Monroe County Medical Society. Headquarters are at the latter institution, 1441 East Ave., Monroe 0886.

Captain Grady of U. S. Navy Dies

Capt. Vincent W. Grady, U. S. Navy retired, an alumnus of old Cathedral High School, foreman of St. Aquinas Institute died Monday, Nov. 27, 1948. In the Naval Hospital at Philadelphia after a brief illness.
His former address in Rochester was CAPT. GRADY 260 Gabriel Dr. He currently resided in Newton, Pa.
During World War II, Captain Grady served as an engineering officer on the carrier USS Saratoga and was awarded a citation by Admiral Chester W. Nimitz.
After attending high school here, Captain Grady received an engineering degree at Columbia University and was attending Syracuse University when he left to enlist in the Navy in 1917 during World War I.
He is survived by his wife, the former Helen McNamara; a son, Daniel M. Grady, San Diego, Calif.; three daughters, Mrs. Donald Carrier, San Diego; Mrs. William F. Thompson, Providence, R. I. and Miss Patricia Grady, Newton; his mother, Mrs. William F. Grady; three sisters, Mrs. Gertrude E. O'Connor, Mrs. J. Arthur Jennings, and Miss Mary Grady, all of Rochester; a brother, Dr. John A. Grady, Abington, Pa.; and five grandchildren.
