Church Unity Octave Will Mark Fortieth Anniversary

Washington—(NC)—Active participation by His Excellency Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States and Archbishop Patrick A. O'Boyle of Washington, will be a highlight of the annual Church Unity Octave, which will be held at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception at the Catholic University of America here next January 18 to 25.

The National Director of the Church Unity Octave is the Reverend Lewis Furlan, S.A., who has initiated a new program of activity in an effort to make this year's observance the most effective of its history since 1908, when it began in the tiny chapel of the Friars of the Atonement at Graymoor, N. Y. The Rev. Andrew Lewis, S.A., will direct the Washington observance of the Octave. Word has come from the Very Rev. Bonaventura Koeler, S.A., Director of the Octave in Rome, that plans have been made for a more impressive and inspiring Octave than last year when several Cardinals, scores of clergymen and thousands of the faithful crowded the Church of the Gesù to pray for the fulfillment of Our Lord's prayer "That they all may be One."

Parish's Adult Classes Exceed Grade School

Pittsburgh—(NC)—An experiment begun two years ago by Sacred Heart Church here of having classes in adult education in the evening has had an unexpected success. This year total enrollment in the evening classes is more than 700, and there are only 675 pupils in Sacred Heart Grade School.

No effort was made to rival adult education classes offered by the public schools, where instruction in business subjects and practical lines are available. Sacred Heart confines its classes to cultural subjects not available in any of the evening schools of this city—psychology, Christian Apologetics, Christian art and architecture, the influence of the Church on the stage and drama, marriage forums, advanced religion courses for college students, and inquirers' classes for those desiring instruction in Catholic doctrines.

Scots Will Restore Historic Seminary

London—(NC)—The first seminary set up in the British Isles after the Reformation—Scalan, in the braes of Glenlivet, North Scotland—is to be restored, it was announced in Glasgow. A group of Scots priests have formed a Scalan Association to further the project.

Primate Challenges Regime To Bare Church-State Facts

 These "resolutions" come not from true representatives of the people but from appointees of the regime. The Primate also states that he has information that some signers of these "resolutions" do so only under the threat of losing their job or being imprisoned. Telling Catholics that he does not want them "to lose their bread," the Cardinal adds: "Every Catholic who signs a protest against me can do it and be aware that he did not act out of free determination."

Budapest—(RNS)—Mounting demands by the Hungarian Communist press for the purging of "anti-democratic" Roman Catholic elements have been climaxed by threats to arrest or force into exile Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty, Primate of Hungary, denounced as the nation's "No. 1 reactionary."

As the cardinal kept aloof in his palace at Esztergom, which he has not left in more than a month, the Court of Summary Jurisdiction submitted a proposal to the Budapest people's court calling for his trial on charges of subversive activities against the State. The court demanded an immediate investigation of Cardinal Mindszenty, declaring there are "serious grounds for suspicion that he is the author of illegal pamphlets issued under his name and thus liable to be charged with breaking the law forbidding anti-democratic conduct."

It was announced here that "Mindszenty pamphlets" were found concealed in the quarters of Jenő Kulai, a railway porter at Szombathely, who allegedly told police who came to arrest him that he had received the literature from Franciscan priests with instructions to distribute them among reliable persons. According to the Communist press, demonstrations against Cardinal Mindszenty have taken place in various areas. In Eger youth reportedly staged a protest in front of the palace of Archbishop Julius Czapik, who recently issued a statement denouncing "unfair attacks" made on the cardinal by anti-clerical elements.

ANOTHER REPORT stated that a delegation of seven Catholic professors in Szeged University headed by Dr. Julius Jaki had called upon Bishop Andrew Hamba of Szeged urging him to support demands for Cardinal Mindszenty's "retirement" in the interest of the Catholic Church in Hungary. The delegation was quoted as saying that Bishop Hamba had recognized the danger to the Church caused by "dissensions."
