**Seminarian Wins National Honor In Art Exhibit**

A St. Bernard's Seminarian, John Da Caprio, won second prize in the National Art Show of Catholic Seminarials held in Cincinnati, according to a N.C. W.C. News Service dispatch, this week.

He won the national honor with an oil painting, "I Am a Worm and No Man." First prize went to Wilfredo Gwinna, S.J., Yuleta College, El Paso, Tex. for a wood carving.

The exhibit was held to aid seminarials in war-stricken countries, such as Germany, Italy and China. The show is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin who was depicted in 14 works.

PROCEEDS from the exhibition of 85 works of art at the Cincinnati Catholic Lending Library contributed considerably to relief of these seminarials abroad in that purchasers paid in terms of CARE food packages.

The show was held under the sponsorship of the American Seminarial War Relief in an attempt to attract national attention to its drive for funds to answer the hundreds of appeals received from foreign seminarials. Persons able to help financially are asked to send checks to the American Seminarial War Relief, Mt. St. Marys, Norwood 12, Ohio. Lists of addresses of needy seminarials will be sent on request. The ASWR is affiliated with War Relief Services - National Catholic Welfare Conference and the Catholic Students Mission Crusade.

The exhibit was held under the direction of a competent young laymen's group, "Veterans' mission-minded veterans of CSMC."

Superior of the Basilian Fathers here in Rochester from 1943 to 1944 and then returned again to Toronto as professor of moral theology where he has taught until his death.

Elected to the General Council of the Congregation of St. Basil in July 1928, he has served on the Council since and in 1936 was elected First Councillor or Assistant Superior General and was reelected last Summer.

He is survived by a brother, the Rev. Joseph Dillon, C.S.B., who is attached to the Basilian Mexican Missions Center at Rosenberg, Texas.
