Alumni Urged To Be Lay Apostles On N. D. Sunday

Graduates of Notre Dame with their training should be more than mere "spectators" of the progress of their faith, they should take an active part in its propagation, members of the Rochester Alumni Club were told Sunday at a Communion Breakfast in Hotel Sheraton.

Marking the 11th annual Universal Notre Dame Communion Sunday, the Notre Dame men heard the Rev. Dr. George F. Kettell, pastor of Old St. Mary's Church following corporate Communion in that church.

DOCTOR KETTELL, a former national chaplain of the American Legion based his talk on the Sunday's gospel and told the university graduates to be not needs shaken in the wind. He urged them to do more than attend Mass on Sunday and then forget their faith during the week. Their years under the Holy Cross Fathers, he said, fitted them for the lay apostolate and entailed the responsibility of actively engaging in it.

John M. Hedges, president of the Rochester Notre Dame Club, presided with other officers recently elected. They are: Vice President, Martin E. Bayer, Secretary Charles Norton, Treasurer, John Norton and Officer-at-Large, John Slattery.

China Aid Backed By County CWV

Unanimous endorsement of the Memorial plan as presented by the Veterans Advisory Committee was voted at the regular meeting of the Monroe County Chapter, Catholic War Veterans Tuesday. County officers and delegates from ten posts met at Holy Rosary Hall and discussed proposals offered to date. Alfred L. Green, County Commander, and CWV representative on the Advisory Committee, outlined the action of this committee thus far.

The Catholic War Veterans thus become the third veteran group to support the split Memorial plan. The Legion County committee met Monday night. Veterans of Foreign War met Tuesday night. All organizations voted approval.

EDWARD W. ESSE was endorsed for the position of County Commander by Our Lady of Perpetual Help Post of which he is past commander. Election will be held at the annual county convention Jan. 16 which will be held in the newly completed Youth Center in East Rochester. Esse has been County Historian for two years. At the CWV State convention in May of last year he was awarded the State Department Commander's medal for his work in behalf of veterans.

Esse has been with the New York State Employment Service since his return from the service in 1945. At present he is the Local Veterans Employment Representative.

The County Chapter also approved a resolution calling for all out aid to China. In presenting his resolution James Ryan pointed out that "we have already spent millions in relief to aid this country in its fight on Communism and now more than ever, we must help China resist the scourge of Communism, which we are also fighting in Western Europe."

"The plight of China cannot be ignored any longer if we hope to have her as an ally." Copies of the resolution are to be sent to President Truman, Secretary of State, George Marshall.

The Bishop was escorted from the rectory by altar boys, color guards of St. Anthony's Post No. 1144 Catholic War Veterans and honor guards of the Knights of Columbus, Elmiria Council and Fourth Degree Assembly.

Prominent at the ceremonies was the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Adolph L. Gabbani, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, Auburn who was founder of St. Anthony's, Elmiria. Some of the original parishioners who greeted him were Joseph Crucill, James Cleri and James DeJaurio.

The church and school were visited by nearly 10,000 persons Sunday who came to inspect the rebuilt structure which rose in much less than two years after the fire.
