 just as Carmelite Sisters anywhere. Could they all be deceived? No, I cannot believe that!
 "WHILE WAITING outside I had noticed from time to time a strong scent of roses. At first I thought it was perfume, but it came to my nostrils again and again; one time I sensed it even in the room. When I mentioned the phenomenon to three youngsters; they rather sheepishly admitted they had, too but thought it was their imagination. On the other hand, there were some who hadn't noticed anything.
 "I told the Sisters of my unusual sensation and they laughed with joy, saying: 'The Blessed Mother said that the scent of roses was a sign of her presence.'"
 Father Patrick says the Mother Prior had the postulant Teresa wrap up a peal for him while he looked on.
 "There is a great deal more that I could divulge," Father Patrick concludes, "but I hesitate to do so because it is so extraordinary."
 "The young girl who received the visions is the daughter of a former governor of Batsanga Province," he says. "She met with a good deal of opposition when she wanted to enter Carmel; in fact, she ran away from home to do it and the family is raising Cain about it. Bishop Offers Requiem For Monsignor E. A. Rawlinson

 Christ-like character, the Bishop told of the zeal and courage he displayed in the 1902 smallpox epidemic when he was chaplain of the Hope Hospital in Rochester.
 "ALL PATIENTS of every faith found consolation from his lips and presence. He insisted on taking all risks, for the love of God, to be with the sick and dying. At the price of getting the fatal disease, he voluntarily lived in 'the pest house' to be near the sick."
 Citing the honor of his elevation to the rank of Domestic Prelate in the Pope's household which came to Monsignor Rawlinson in the fiftieth year of his priesthood, Bishop Kearney called it "a seal of approval for a noble career, a gesture on the part of the Church and the Holy Father for a life well served."
 Born in Liverpool, England, in 1873, Monsignor Rawlinson came to the United States at the age of eight and attended Immaculate Conception School in Ithaca followed by studies in St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminars in Rochester.
 HE WAS ordained in June, 1898, a member of the sixth ordination class of St. Bernard's. Four other surviving members of that class are Rt. Rev. Magr. Thomas F. Connors, pastor of Blessed Sacrament Church, Rt. Rev. Magr. George V. Burns, pastor of Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral, the Rev. James B. Keenan of St. Anne's Home and the Rt. Rev. Magr. A. B. Barber of New Orleans. La. They observed the golden jubilee of their ordination this summer.
 First appointed as assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Mt. Morris and St. Mary's Church, Rochester, Monsignor Rawlinson was named vice-chancellor of the diocese in February, 1910 and chaplain of the St. Patrick's and St. Mary's Orphanages.
 He was appointed to the pastorate of St. Patrick's in 1921 and has been held in high honor in Corning for his zealous parochial administration, for his interest in the youth of his parish and for generous participation in all civic activities.
 NAMED A DOMESTIC PRELATE by Pope Pius XII on Oct. 10, 1947, he was invested with the Sacred Heart robes at the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the Conring Council, Knights of Columbus, Monsignor Rawlinson received the congratulations of the city for his papal honors received in the fiftieth year of his priesthood.
 Surviving the deceased pastor are three brothers, Wilfred of Billingham, Washington, and Francis and Charles of Rochester; and a sister Miss Margaret Rawlinson of Corning.
 After the casket was brought from the rectory to St. Patrick's Church on Monday, priests of the diocese chanted the Office of the Dead in the church on Monday evening and members of the parish Holy Name Society and Corning Council 4th Degree Knights of Columbus maintained a guard of honor through the night.

Stalin Heading For Crack-up, Paper Warns

London—(NC) — "The true Christian is not dismayed by Stalin's enmities. They are bound to crack," the London Catholic Times writes. "Nothing can be more sound than a policy of deliberate falsehood. In the nature of things it is bound sooner or later to boomerang back to the perpetrator."
 "In 1948 Hitler appeared to have conquered Europe," the paper continues. "In 1941 his own people tried to assassinate him. A year later he died, probably by his own hand."
 The paper, which was commenting on Stalin's latest message to his people, added: "In the first impact, human beings in the mass, when assailed by concentrated, well-thought-out propaganda directed by unscrupulous overlords who control all the channels of information, do fall victims to the deception. But there comes a time when the elaborate deception collapses of its own unsoundness."
