Final Tribute To W. J. Beahon Paid

Funeral services for William J. Beahon, 73, of 26 Hubbell Park, a retired school teacher and accountant and a veteran auditor and usher of Immaculate Conception Church, were held Wednesday, Dec. 15, 1948, at the Malloran Funeral Home, Plymouth Ave. South, and at the church.
 The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph S. Cameron, pastor, celebrated the Mass with the Rev. George S. Wood as deacon and the Rev. Donald Micalizio as subdeacon. Among priests in the sanctuary were the Reverend Fathers Leo V. Smith, John E. Rosch, James P. Collins and Gerald E. Dunn. Final blessing at the grave in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was conducted by Monsignor Cameron and Father Collins.
 Bearers were Frank J. G. Connor, John J. Skelly, William Rathburn, Eugene McFarland, Harry Green and William Clark. Delegates were present from Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, and from the Loyal Order of Moose.
 Mr. Beahon died of a heart attack early Sunday, Dec. 12, 1948 at his home. A teacher of commercial bookkeeping at West High School for 27 years before he retired three years ago, he also taught for a time in Washington Junior High School and at the Rochester Business Institute's evening and summer sessions.
 A native of Bristol, Mr. Beahon received his primary education in that village and then attended Canandaigua Academy. To obtain his teacher credentials

he studied later in several business schools. Before coming to Rochester, about 40 years ago, he taught commercial bookkeeping in Vermont.
 He was a Third Degree Knight of Columbus and a member of the Holy Name Society, the Nocturnal Adoration Society and the Order of Moose.

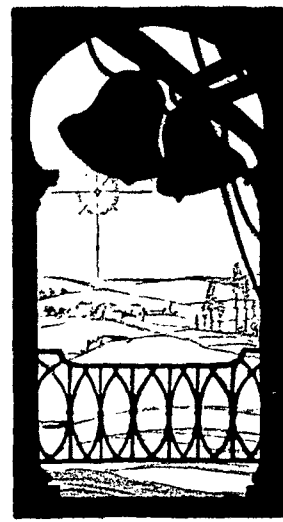
Inauguration Set At Aquinas
