Following is a letter from the Innsbruck Carmelite Cloister, Admargasse 25, Tyrol, Austria, dated Oct. 22:

DEAR SIR: Yesterday we received from the Vienna Charities three packages marked Will 1 to 3, and were overjoyed on unpacking them to find the precious articles of clothing.

Our little cloister was struck three times by bombs. The last bombing attack on Innsbruck was April 20, and a bomb fell on our little church.

Many, many cares and worries are unfortunately mixed with our joy over restoration of our church. For a long while we have been without money enough to pay the high cost of building.
