**Lourdes Pilgrimage**  
 New York — (RNS) — Archbishop Joseph F. Rummel of New Orleans will lead a pilgrimage to Rome, and Lourdes next summer, it was learned here.

**Archbishop of Warsaw Named**

Warsaw — (RNS) — Bishop Stephan Wyszynski of Lublin has been named Archbishop of Gniezno and Warsaw by Pope Pius XII, it was announced here. He succeeds August Cardinal Hlond, who died last October.

As incumbent of the Gniezno see, Cardinal Hlond ranked as Primate of Poland, but there has been no indication as yet as to whether Archbishop-designate Wyszynski will assume the primacy. A primate ordinarily functions only in countries which have a concordat with the Vatican. The Vatican-Poland concordat was abrogated by the Polish government shortly after the liberation.

Forty-eight years old and regarded as an outstanding scholar and expert on social questions, Archbishop Wyszynski became Bishop of Lublin in 1945, also being placed in charge of the Catholic university in that city.

Archbishop Wyszynski received the doctorate of Canon Law at the Lublin university in 1929, and after pursuing sociological studies abroad for two years, was given charge of a parish in Wloclawek, where he remained until he was made Bishop of Lublin. During the war, he was banished from his parish by the Germans.

**Polish Exiles Make Spiritual Problem**

London — (NC) — About 130 Polish priests have charge of the spiritual welfare of some 130,000 Poles in Britain, it was announced here at the annual meeting of the Catholic Council for Polish Welfare. Most of these Poles are political refugees, and about 85 per cent of them young, unmarried men.

They include 3,000 university students, 2,000 of them in London, but the great majority are poorly educated, peasant types who, the report says, are likely to drift into the moral laxity which they find around them. The report calls for more priests to help these exiles, pointing out that they are widely scattered throughout the country. About 2,600 Polish children need religious instruction, it adds.

 Milwaukee — (NC) — A biography of John England, lighting first Bishop of Charleston and father of the Catholic Press in the United States, entitled "John England — American Christopher," headlines the Spring list of the Bruce Publishing Company. It has been announced.

**Nun-Author Says, 'Comics Here To Stay' Writes Own Scripts To Combat Trash**

El Paso, Tex. — (NC) — Comic books have a definite place in education. The way to counteract the influence of evil comics is not simply to prohibit and confiscate them but to match them in appeal with worthwhile comics.

So believes Sister M. Lilliana Owens of Loretto Academy here. The nun, widely known as a historian and educator among the Spanish-speaking people of the Southwest, has put her belief into practice by writing comic-book scripts.

**ONE OF THESE**, "Key's Toast to the Flag of the U.S.A.," was done for the Treasure Chest, published by George Pfaff, of Dayton, O. Now she has written the history of her community, the Sisters of Loretto in comic-book style. It has been published under the title, "Loretto — The Monument of Nerinckx," by the Catechetical Guild of St. Paul, publishers of the comic monthly Topix.

Sister Lilliana first became aware of the possibilities of comic books while teaching at a high school in New Mexico. One of her boys, Tony, better acquainted with athletics than with scholarship, turned in a fine paper on Marlin de Porres, and it developed that he derived his information and interest in the Peruvian Saint from the Catechetical Guild's publication.

**QUESTIONING THE BOY**, Sister Lilliana learned that he was having trouble with English, and that phrases in the ordinary textbooks served to confuse him. The pictures in the comic book, however, helped him with the language and at the same time furthered his interest in the historical and religious aspects of Marlin de Porres' career.

"I was convinced after my talk with Tony," the nun explained, "that comics have a definite place in education — visual education — which is so necessary, and especially necessary where the bilingual problem is so outstanding. I decided also that we must help make them good in order to counteract the effects of the bad comic."

Simply to prohibit and confiscate objectionable comics is no remedy for a comic-book addict, she continued. "Comic-book addiction is a symptom that indicates a lack of balance in the child's home and school environment, especially in the matter of entertainment. With such children the good comic must be substituted for the bad. Teachers and parents must be on their toes as to the nature of the current comic books and

also the names of the Catholic comic books."

"Monthly there are new comics appearing and old ones are disappearing," Sister Lilliana stated. "It is well for us to remember that under pressure of the critics many publishers have changed the name of their comics from bad to good within one or two issues. The comics then revert back to their original type when this criticism relaxes."

"Comics are here to stay," according to the nun. "Lazy reading," you say; yes, maybe, but so is the movie. We must make use of this new aid to visual education by giving them classic comics, such as the Lad of Lima, Don Bosco, Tale of Two Cities, Uncle Tom's Cabin (maybe). But most of all we must make use of our great chance to visualize the great field of American Catholic Church history. Frontier history is filled with stories that will thrill and fill the minds of our youth."

**PMs in Communist Hungary Members of Reformed Faith**

Budapest — (RNS) — Stephen Dobi, the new Prime Minister of Hungary, is a Reformed Church layman. It is an interesting fact that all five Prime Ministers of Hungary since the end of the war have been members of the Reformed Church.

Dobi was elected President of the newly-declared Hungarian Republic on February 1, 1946.

His successor was Francis Nagy, a layman of the Reformed Church, who left Hungary as a political emigre in May, 1947, and is now living in the United States.

Louis Dinnyes, the now-retiring Prime Minister, is also a member of the Reformed Church.

**'Family Life' Sets Convention**

Washington — (NC) — The 17th annual convention of the National Catholic Conference on Family Life, to be held in San Francisco from March 7 to 9, will be augmented by additional sessions designed to appeal particularly to the clergy, it has been announced here.

The Rev. Dr. Edgar Schrrieder, C.S.B., director of the Family Life Bureau, National Catholic Welfare Conference, said these added sessions will deal with premarital instructions, the theology of marriage, the liturgy and the family, the family retreat, and marriage counseling.

He said that priests from 15 dioceses of the United States will take part in these sessions with a view toward strengthening the movement throughout the country for a program of short family retreats.

The general theme of the convention will be "Preparation for Marriage," and will be discussed by Bishop Peter M. Bartholome, Coadjutor of St. Cloud and Episcopal Moderator of the Family Life Bureau.
