Michigan Theaters Ban Robert Mitchum

Detroit — (NC) — Motion picture stars who get into "jams" and scandals may be properly eschewed by producers but they are regarded as liabilities by movie house owners of the Allied Theaters of Michigan.

The Allied group through its executive secretary Charles W. Snyder, announced that henceforth its 250 members would reject photoplays starring or featuring Robert Mitchum. Holy wood actor, who was convicted of possession of marijuana cigarettes.

The Michigan association's action was to invoke the policy adopted by the National Allied States Association of Motion Picture Exhibitors at its national convention in New Orleans.

Cardinal Claims Television Will Join Humanity

Paris — (NC) — Television "is a new means of unity for humanity," declared His Eminence Emmanuel Cardinal Suhard, Archbishop of Paris, in a sermon at the Christmas Midnight Mass in the Cathedral of Notre Dame, the first religious ceremony to be telecast in France.

Declaring that "this wonderful invention comes at its appointed time in the plan for the salvation of the world," the Cardinal continued, "Everything that draws individuals and peoples closer together and makes of them a single human family leads to redemption. That is what television does by extending the field of our vision, it expands the field of our awareness and enlarges our hearts."

"Depending on our senses," he declared, "we need to see one another in order to understand and mutually aid one another. By bringing us ever closer to each other, it prepares us, according to our dispositions, either to hate more or, on the contrary, to love more. It can become in its way one of the most effective architects of peace."

Cardinal Suhard, however, also warned against the effects of the evil use of television, saying, "Yes, the temptation is terrible for men with eyes that can pierce walls to substitute their own omnipotence for that of God."

Prelate Scores French Quarter Entertainment

New Orleans — (NC) — A letter from Archbishop Joseph E. Rummel of New Orleans calling on the local press and public officials to cooperate in raising the moral level of entertainment provided in the French Quarter here was read at a meeting of representatives of Catholic and civil organizations. The meeting, sponsored by the Young Men's Business Club, discussed ways and means of cleaning up the entertainment.

The French Quarter night clubs, the Archbishop's letter stated, "offer a form of entertainment which caters principally to the most degraded element of tourist trade and constitutes a challenge to the civic conscience of the decent and respectable citizenry."
