Corning CDA Hear Bishop To Launch Drive Honoring Father Bruton

A \$175,000 campaign to build a new St. Margaret Mary's Church and Rectory in Rogers Parkway will be launched Monday evening, Jan. 31. Upwards of 300 campaigners will gather in the school auditorium to hear Bishop James E. Keane...

Funds from the campaign will partially cover the cost of the church which will be dedicated just before next Christmas, according to present plans.

When completed the new St. Margaret Mary's Church will seat 1100 people and rank as one of the largest structures in the Rochester Diocese.

ARTHUR J. BAMANN, general chairman of the drive announced this week that the campaign will be continued through February 14 with a preliminary report dinner scheduled for February 7.

Men of the parish are being organized into divisions and teams under Bamann's direction. John M. Blackwood is co-chairman of the drive and Dr. Aldo J. Francati is chairman of the Special Committee.

Parishioners of St. Margaret Mary's will launch the campaign as a personal tribute to their pastor, the Rev. Charles J. Bruton, founder of the parish and honorary chairman of the present fund-raising effort.

It was just twenty years ago in 1929 that Father Bruton founded the parish which has grown from 500 to 2,650 parishioners in two decades.

The original frame church, still in use seats only 450 people and has long since been too small for parish needs. In 1930, the first school was built and in 1937 a new convent constructed for the Franciscan sisters who staff the school. A sizeable addition to the school was built in 1947.

FATHER BRUTON will outline plans for the campaign when he speaks at all Masses on next Sunday, January 23.

A chaplain in the First World War and a former teacher at Aquinas Institute, Father Bruton is widely known throughout the Rochester Diocese. During the last war he served as chaplain for the New York State Guard and has been active in American Legion circles for many years.

Under his direction, the parish has organized a Men's Club, an Altar Society, Boy Scout Troop and Young People's Club.

The Church Unity Octave, a devotion special to the Priars of the Atonement, now with a community in Montour Falls, is being marked by the Rev. David F. Gannon, S.A., Guardian of St. John's Atonement Seminary, with a series of talks at St. Mary's of the Lake Church in Watkins Glen.

Jan. 22—That Christians in America may become one in communion with the Chair of St. Peter.

Jan. 23—The return to the sacraments of all lapsed Catholics.

Jan. 24—The conversion of the Jews.

Jan. 25—The missionary conquest of the world for Christ.

A HIGH MASS for the intentions of the Octave will be celebrated on Sunday, Jan. 23, the Rev. Benedict Elmman, pastor of St. Mary's of the Lake, announced.

The observance of the Church Unity Octave was extended by Pope Benedict XV to the Universal Church and enriched with indulgences, on Feb. 25, 1916. It had its inception in 1908 under

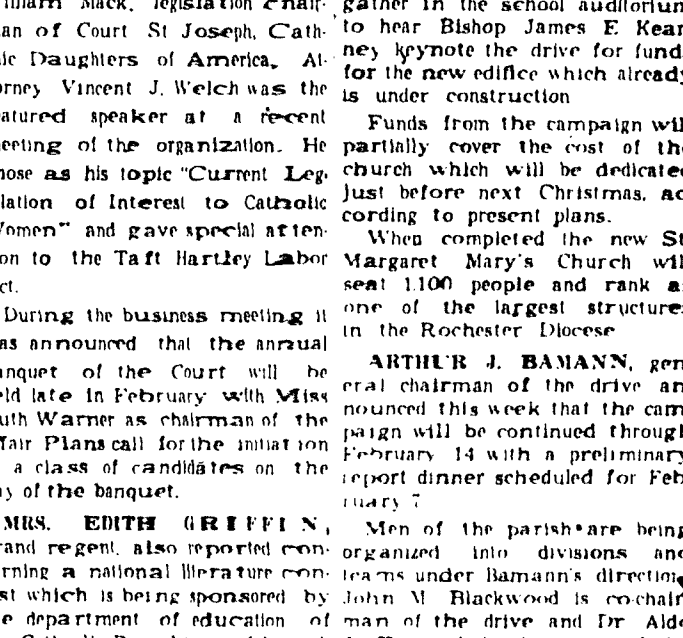
Case Worker Talk Heard By Society

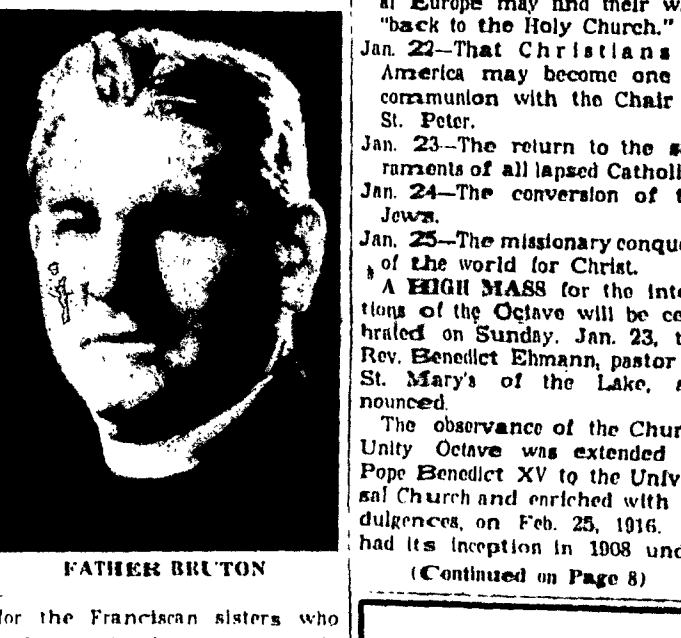
Mrs. Snow was to speak on "The Agency Program," according to Mrs. Catharine Hutchings, a member of the Program Planning Committee.
