Genevans have a particular interest in the above picture of St. Ann's Church, Heidelberg, Germany. They contributed \$500 towards its rehabilitation. The structure was almost completely demolished by bombs during World War II.



Rebuilt again, the picture above shows the benediction service which was held to commemorate the reopening of the church. It is now available for use as a Catholic military chapel.
