A breakfast was held at the Valley Inn, Caledonia and the reception was held in their home, Oak Knoll, from 2 p.m. to 11 p.m.

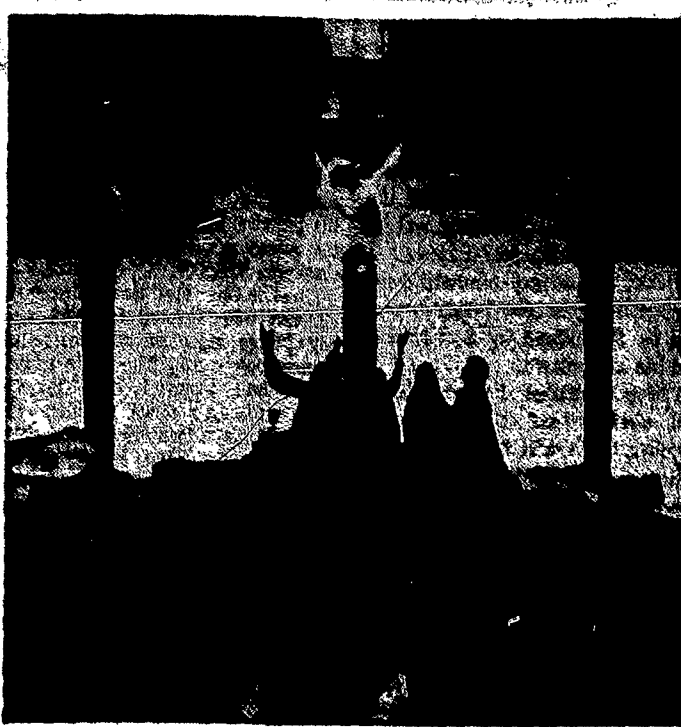

**Fr. Cirrincione To Head
Pilgrimage To Fatima**

The office of the International Catholic Travel Service in Washington, D. C., has announced that it is planning a National Pilgrimage of Reparation to Fatima next August with visits to Rome and Lourdes.

The pilgrims will travel both by air and sea.

The Rev. Joseph A. Cirrincione, Pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, will be spiritual director of the Pilgrimage. The purpose of the Pilgrimage will be to offer reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and to pray for the conversion of Russia and world peace, he states.

In connection with this intention, a spiritual bouquet of prayers, penances and good works is being formed with Catholics everywhere invited to contribute.

LEAFLETS for this purpose can be obtained by writing to Father Cirrincione at 77 Whitney St., Rochester 11, N. Y. or at any of the Catholic book stores.

The spiritual bouquet will be presented to the Bishop of Leiria who will be the host of the pilgrims at Fatima.

Upon arrival at Lisbon, the pilgrims will be received by His Eminence, Manuel Cardinal Cerejeira, Patriarch of Lisbon, in Rome, they will be received in audience by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII. Provision will be made for those who so desire to visit Paris and Lourdes as well.
