Largest Catholic Radio Show Heard by 15 Million Daily

St. Louis — (Special) — The largest Catholic radio program in the world, beamed 1500 times a week as a free public service to bring religious inspiration and information to Catholics and non-Catholics, is the Sacred Heart Program. This month it marks the end of its ninth year of consecutive daily broadcasting.

Emphasizing the appeal of the Sacred Heart for consecration and reparation, "the broadcast have broken down prejudice, built up understanding and taught tolerance while promoting faithful prayer and spreading spiritual strength for the sick and shut-ins," according to its international director, the Rev. Eugene P. Murphy, S.J.

In the Rochester Diocese, two stations carry the Sacred Heart program: WRNY, every weekday at 7:45 a. m., and WVET, each Sunday morning at 8:15 a. m.

THIS PROGRAM which originates with the Jesuit Fathers at St. Louis University, made its 2248th consecutive broadcast this week. It is heard over 648 stations throughout the world, and has an estimated daily listening audience of 15,000,000 persons.

Letters from listeners show this religious broadcast is heard in drug stores, beauty shops and barber shops, dime stores, restaurants, bus terminals, factories, homes, prisons, veterans' hospitals and even on the street cars and buses from portable radios. It is heard from stations in Sydney, Australia; Vattian City, Singapore; Shanghai, Trinidad, Panama, Malta, British Guiana and the Philippine Islands as well as over hundreds of stations in the United States and Canada.

EACH PROGRAM runs 14½ minutes. It opens with the hymn, "O Sacred Heart O Love Divine." The Morning Offering, and the hymn for the day follows.

The heart of the program is a 6 minute doctrinal or devotional talk by one of the staff speakers. The speaking staff includes 27 Jesuit priests. The broadcast reads with the **Angelus** against a symphonic background of the Ave Maria. The program is famous for its music. This has included broadcasts by the Robert Mitchell boys' choir of the Metropolitan, star, Francesco Valentini, Jessica Dragonette and Joseph Laderoute; the scholastic choirs of St. Louis University, St. John Cantius Seminary, and Weston College; the Sacred Heart Quartet and the Pontbonne College Women's chorus.

FR. MURPHY believes that bringing the program into the homes of workers with the philosophy of Christ and the force of prayer is perhaps one of the most effective ways of combating communism. The Jesuit directors have received an amazing collection of mail-responses to the program. A cook on a railway dining car out of Denver, a constant listener, sent a dollar. A carnival performer sent a letter of praise. A patient in the Leprosarium at Carville, La. wrote: "The program gave us new strength and courage and renewed hope. In our case we need hope and faith in God's mercy so badly." Fifty patients in the same leper colony belong to the Sacred Heart Shrine Club.

The program broadcast now enters its Federal and State Penitentiaries and the most interesting of all letters received are from inmates of such institutions. This form of service fulfills the injunction of Christ, "I was in prison, and you came

to me." Chaplains are unending in their praise of this apostolate.

Twenty-five Veterans' Administration hospitals rebroadcast the program from their own local radio rooms.

THE PRISON APOSTOLATE has been particularly successful in the East with daily broadcasts sustained at Charlestown Prison, Mass., Howard Prison, R. I., Dannemora, N. Y., and in two large penitentiaries in eastern Pennsylvania.

Kentucky Judge Bars State Aid For Church Hospitals

Frankfort, Ky.—(RNS)—A Kentucky circuit judge has barred state aid for church-backed or other private hospitals. If upheld by the Court of Appeals, Kentucky's highest court, the ruling will wipe out \$300,000 allocated to three hospitals under a 1948 Legislative Act.

Haywood Hospital, non-denominational institution at Maysville, Ky. allocated \$100,000 for adding a floor to its public facilities. Other institutions which have sought aid include the \$5,500,000 Methodist Evangelical Hospital, Louisville and Methodist Hospital at Pikeville.

Blind Girl, 12, Is Radio Star

New York — (NC) — A 12-year-old girl, parishioner of St. John the Evangelist Church here, has become the star of a radio program heard each Sunday at 3:15 p.m., EST, over the American Broadcasting Company network.

Her name is Betty Clark. She is a singer and her voice has won the plaudits of critics. The younger she grows, the more a number of handicaps to attain radio stardom, but success has left her unscathed. In addition to singing, she likes to play the piano, dance and roller skate. Her father died on New Year's Day. Her mother is ill. But the most remarkable aspect of the Betty Clark success story is — she is blind. She reads portions of her script from Braille.

Catholics Gain In Philippines

New York — (NC) — The Catholic population in the Diocese of Mindanao, Republic of the Philippines, has increased by 138,770, or 33 1/3 per cent, since the beginning of the war in 1941, according to a detailed report made to Jesuit Missions magazine by the Rev. Andrew Cerrini, S.J. of the Zamboanga Mission. The report fixed the present number of Catholics in the diocese at over a half million, who are served by 68 priests — an average of one priest for every 7,900 Catholics.

THE DIOCESE is administered by Bishop Luis A. del Rosario and covers an area of 25,831 square miles. It has three provinces: Zamboanga with 250,000 Catholics; Cotabato with 60,000 Catholics; and Davao with 226,386 Catholics.
