Immoral Hollywood Trends Criticized by Churchmen

New York—(RNS)—America's film capital has become a concern of churchmen, not only in this country, but abroad. Religious groups are increasingly preoccupied with Hollywood's morals in its film output.

Churchmen in this country, while deploring moral laxity in the film colony, have been even more disturbed by press reports of the laxity. They have accused the press of featuring and sensationalizing stories of alleged loose morals among screen people.

A Hollywood pastor, Dr. Louis Hadley Evans, of First Presbyterian Church, recently declared that the press gave a one-sided picture of Hollywood. He stressed that many motion picture people are regular churchgoers. They do not make the headlines for going to church and participating in church activities, he added, because "nobody does."

REGARDING HOLLYWOOD'S output, the churches are attempting to raise standards generally. Church leaders have, from time to time, reminded the motion picture industry of its moral obligations.

Not so long ago, Chicago's Archbishop, Samuel Cardinal Stritch, told the annual convention of the Theatre Owners of America that "movies stand condemned of certain things."

In many instances, he said, "they have catered to the low and debasing appetites of man. They have sometimes inculcated sexual immorality. They have frequently given a false picture of life."

"There has been a false impression in some places," the prelate continued, "that the few bad films have the greater drawing power. But actual surveys have shown that movies with sound moral value and free from fifth have a much greater drawing power."

A proposal submitted to the International Catholic Film Congress, at its annual meeting in Venice, urged an international prayer crusade for the "Spiritual Progress" of the film industry, in various countries.

THIS PREOCCUPATION was crystallized in a report from Sydney, Australia, stating that churchmen of all faiths on that continent are incensed at movie actress Rita Hayworth because of her public association with Moslem Prince Aly Khan. The prince is said to have announced that he would divorce his present wife to marry the Hollywood star.

According to the Sydney report, Australian clergymen generally are in agreement with a Hollywood trade paper which urged the motion picture industry "to wash its hands" of Miss Hayworth.

Indicative of the attitude of some church people to Hollywood morals was the comment of a Melbourne clergyman who said it was "refreshing to find that Hollywood was recognizing that there were limits which even the laxity of Hollywood could not let go unrebuked."

A Baptist clergyman in Sydney said it would be unfair to condemn only Miss Hayworth as "Hollywood's morals have slipped so low."

A spokesman for the Roman Catholic Church asserted it would be unjust to criticize Rita Hayworth "without condemning half the population of Hollywood."

Rome Regrets Power Rites

Rome — (NC)—The sensational events surrounding the marriage of screen actors Tyrone Power and Linda Christian at the Church of Santa Francesca Romana before Rt. Rev. Msgr. William E. Hemmick, American canon attached to St. Peter's Church, "dismayed" officials who had hoped that the wedding would not arouse such public frenzy.

The ceremony was performed in a Hollywood tone in the consecration of local Church authorities.

Long before it began dozens of workmen were at the scene stringing cables setting up lights and connecting microphones. Dynamos were pulled up outside the church to supply the electrical deficiencies of the fourteenth century edifice.

The immense crowd of curious and enthusiastic fans of the movie stars caused scenes of good-natured violence in the streets outside the church and created such noise that orally persons in the front pews, the church could hear the words of the ceremony.

Mr. Power had declared himself publicly and privately as displeased with the "circus" aspects of the affair but the almost universal reaction of the curious crowds was "whose wedding is this?"

Apart from its surroundings, the ceremony was fulfilled in the form required by the Church for the celebration of the Sacrament of Marriage, with an exchange of consent in the presence of an authorized priest and witnesses.

Bill Asks Ban On Radio Crime

Madison, Wis. (RNS)—A measure designed to prohibit radio broadcasting of "scenes of bloodshed, lust or crime" has been introduced in the state legislature here. It is expected to be widely supported by church, parent and civic groups.

The broadcasting proposal introduced by Senator Taylor G. Brown of Oshkosh at the request of the Lutheran Ladies' Association, would amend laws covering obscene language and publicity.

It would provide penalties for anyone who broadcast "any story, description or account of deeds of bloodshed, lust or crime other than a current news event or any program, discourse, conversation, ballad, expression or other utterance containing any obscene language description or suggestion tending to the corruption of morals."

Christophers Plan May Day Program

New York (NC)—The third annual observance of May 1 as Our Lady's day for the offering of prayers for the Russian people and those in Soviet dominated countries, will be held on larger scale this year. It has been announced by The Christophers which originated the observance in 1946. Headquarters of the movement has received information from Christophers both in this country and abroad telling of plans to enlarge the observance this year.
