WELCOME EX-SENATOR
Card. Mindszenty Arrest Protested By Waverly K. C.
 Waverly—Protesting the arrest of Cardinal Mindszenty by Hungary's Red Government, Waverly Council, Knights of Columbus representing more than 100 men in the community is sending a telegram to President Truman together with telegrams to Senators Irving Ives and Robert F. Wagner and Congressman Sterling Cole registering its protests. The telegrams will be followed by personal letters from the membership. The action was taken at a meeting on Tuesday evening in the Albertson Building with Grand Knight Louis Farr presiding. "THE CARDINAL was arrested because of his fight for the rights and freedom of the Hungarian people," the protest "It has been obvious for several months that only the Catholic Church stood between the Communists and their complete enslavement of the people. The Church has been personified by the loyal and God-fearing, loyal of loyal God and country." "Shall our government allow another travesty of justice such as was recently seen in the mock trial of Archbishop Stepinac go without any public pronouncement?" "As loyal Catholic American citizens we urge our government to denounce firmly these flagrant violations of the Atlantic Charter. Yalta and the rest, so as to guarantee all men their God-given rights."

 "America is in the fight to win because to lose means the end of individual human rights. We are fighting against a poisonous philosophy of government which would destroy the free way of living as set forth in our Constitution. We want only an opportunity to live in a free world. We seek not to interfere in foreign governments but to halt interference in government of democratic nations. "We want to disarm nations when it is safe to do so. We want to outlaw war and control the atomic bomb. We want an instrument to settle disputes without war. We want a strong United Nations, not only to outlaw war but to enhance forever, peace and make prosperity secure — we want peace on earth."
