State K. of C. Post Given To Oswego Unit Secretary

Utica — Appointment of Frank M. Linehan of Oswego as Executive Assistant to the State Knights of Columbus is announced today by State Deputy William E. Burke.

As executive assistant to the State Deputy, Linehan will aid in the carrying out of the program of the State Council. His position was created by action of the Council meeting in Rochester in May 1948.

The State Council is made up of 250 councils in as many communities in the state. Membership is close to 100,000 members, making this state the largest jurisdiction in the Order.

THE GROWTH OF THE Order in recent years necessitated additional assistance to the State Deputy in correlating the program and assisting subordinate councils in accomplishing the objectives of the Order. Linehan's headquarters for the present will be in Utica.

The appointee is a native of Schenectady. He is a 1945 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, with a bachelor of science degree in business administration.

Linehan joins the State Council after serving as executive secretary of Oswego Council, Knights of Columbus, for the past three years. He also served as secretary of the Central New York Chapter, Knights of Columbus.

He is a member of Oswego Council; Oswego Assembly, Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus; Loja Caravan, Order of Alhambra; Alumni Association of the University of Notre Dame; Central New York Notre Dame Club and Kiwanis International.

Youth Active In Portugal Election

 Lisbon — (NC) — The choice of a former high masonic official as the presidential candidate of the opposition party and a statement issued by the Catholic Youth Movement warning its followers against masonic or communist political movements have stirred great interest for Catholics in the presidential race here. The election is scheduled for February 13.

THIS YEAR marks the first time that the government has permitted the naming of an opposition candidate for a presidential election since it came to power in 1926. The opposition has chosen 62-year-old Gen. Jose Norton de Matos, former grand master of the Grand Orient Freemasons and a prominent member of the political group which came into power after the revolution of 1910.

The government party has proposed President Antonio Oscar de Fragoao Carmona, 79, for reelection. He has held the post since he was first elected in 1926. His term expires April 15.

NEITHER HIS Eminence Cardinal Goncalves Cerejeira, Patriarch of Lisbon, nor any other member of the Portuguese Hierarchy has made any pronouncement on the election. Two or three priests have written articles on behalf of the opposition group.

The statement made by the Catholic Youth Movement, which is under ecclesiastical direction, emphasizes that the Church is above politics but adds that Catholics are in conscience bound to support only those candidates who will safeguard the rights of the Church. It declares that all Catholics have a serious obligation, first of all, to vote; but, secondly, to vote only for those political factions which are not joined with organizations condemned by the Church such as communism or freemasonry.

THE CATHOLIC YOUTH statement urges its followers to take a strong stand against youth groups which parade under a false standard of liberty and democracy and are really directed by communists. "These groups encourage the membership of Catholics, but only to separate them from their Bishops by painting the latter as fascists," the statement says.

Press censorship has been partially lifted by the government of Premier Antonio de Oliveira Salazar for the election campaign.

Pamphlet Sales Now 13 Million; Buffalo Lauded

Washington — (NC) — The Buffalo Diocesan Pamphlet Society is credited with "a most effective distribution" by the "Index of Catholic Pamphlets" released here.

The Buffalo group has established 315 pamphlet racks in parishes and institutions, and in 1947 distributed 122,380 titles, according to the "Index."

American Catholic pamphlets are selling at the rate of more than 18,000,000 a year, statistics reveal. Total sales are approximately double those during the 1930s.

Leading pamphlet publisher is the Faithful Press of New York, the report showed. Last year it sold 5,638,806 pamphlets at prices ranging from 3 to 25 cents. The Queen's Work of St. Louis ranked second among publishers and the Catholic Information Society of New York third.

The "Index" lists 847 pamphlet titles. For the first time it includes selections from catalogues of the Catholic Truth Society of London, the Catholic Truth Society of Dublin, the Irish Messenger Office and the Catholic Social Guild of Oxford.

Canandaigua HNS Protests Trial Of Hungary Primate

Canandaigua — A resolution protesting the "trial" of Cardinal Mindszenty as "a travesty on justice" was unanimously adopted by 160 members of St. Mary's Church Holy Name Society on Sunday, Feb. 6.

T. Hamilton Kennedy was elected president of the Society by the large number of men who received Holy Communion in a body at the 8 o'clock Mass and held breakfast and a meeting in the church hall.

Others elected included Frank H. Dhondt, vice president; Daniel A. Farchione, secretary; Francis J. Rice, treasurer; Thomas J. O'Sullivan and Sesto Vecchi, delegate to the Diocesan HNS Union.

NEXT COMMUNION breakfast of the Society will be held on Holy Name Sunday, Mar. 13, at 8:45 a. m. according to the Rev. John F. Duffy, assistant pastor of St. Mary's and spiritual director of the parish Holy Name Society.

Discussion of a revision of the constitution, frequency of meetings and amount of dues will comprise the business for the next meeting, Father Duffy said. Official Holy Name manual-sales will be distributed to all present.

Communism Said Modern Scourge

Lisbon — (CIP) — "Communism is a scourge sent into a de-Christianized society because it has failed to translate into practice the Christian doctrines of social justice and to make the brotherhood of man a reality," Manuel Cardinal Goncalves Cerejeira, Patriarch of Lisbon, declared in a radio address.

"The accusations which Communism has been launching against present-day society are not entirely unfounded," the Cardinal declared.

"Although Christian by tradition, Western civilization is dominated by secularism which has deprived society of Christian spirituality... Viewed in this light, Communism is nothing but the last logical step in the process of de-Christianization."

Communism, the Cardinal Patriarch stated, has been able to grow strong because "it has become for those who are without religion: a totalitarian concept of life, a mystical doctrine of salvation with Christ. It has spread because it appeals to the legitimate desires of men who are hungry for social justice and world brotherhood."
