In an interview with his family, we learn that he entered the army in July '45, trained in Georgia and was picked for assignment at Finance school at Ft. Harrison, Indiana. A few months after being assigned to a post at Ft. Riley, Kansas he was selected for Officers Candidate School along with 66 others and was among the 36 who graduated as 2nd Lieutenants. Until September 1948, he was instructed at the new finance department at St. Louis and soon afterwards sailed for Yokohama arriving on November 29. He received his assignment in Zama. In his letters John is impressed by the work that the Irish Sisters are doing in Japan.
