For a time he was a full time professor at St. Andrew's teaching church music and English.

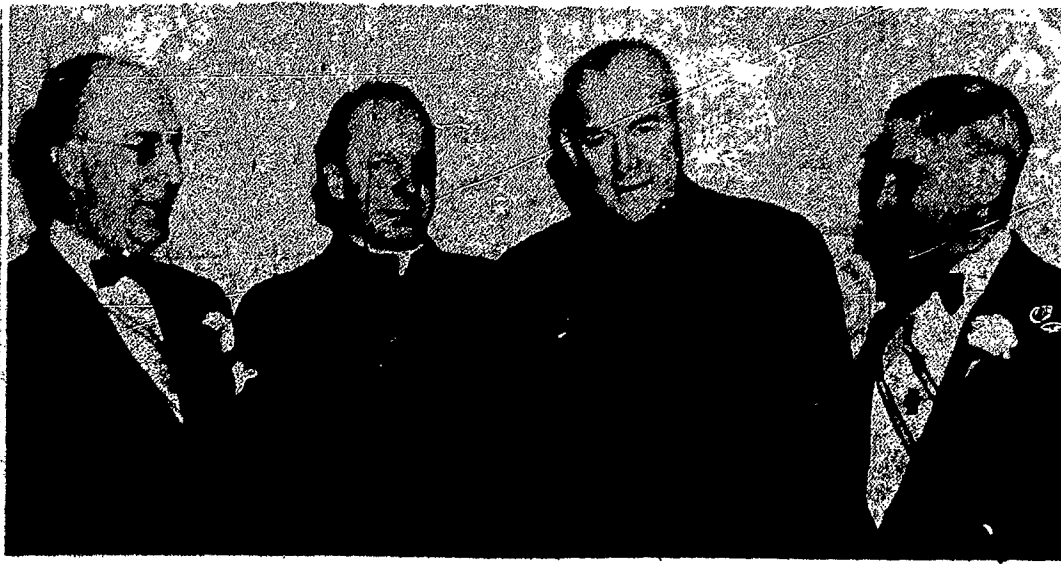
