**Cardinal's Trial, Topic
Set By Culture Lecturer**

Tibor Eckhardt, who was mentioned during the trial of Josef Cardinal Mindszenty as a Hungarian political adviser maintaining "subversive connections" with the prelate, will lecture at Aquinas auditorium Sunday evening, Feb. 27 at 8:15 p.m. His topic will be the trial of the Hungarian prime minister.

Eckhardt's appearance will mark the tenth and final lecture of the current Christian Culture Series, according to the Rev. Hugh J. Haefly, C.S.B., director. A member of a noble Hungarian family, Tibor Eckhardt is a graduate of the Budapest Piarists College and holds degrees in law and political science from the Universities of Budapest, Berlin and Paris.

Forced to leave Hungary in 1941 because of his activities in opposition to the Nazis, he also gained a reputation as an aggressive opponent of the Hungarian Communist party.
