Tolerance Theme Of Fr. Ehmann's Talk To CDA Unit

Coming—Tolerance, its shades and meanings, was the theme of the talk given by the Rev. Benedict Ehmann, pastor of St. Mary's of the Lake Church, Watkins, before more than 150 members and guests of Court St. Joseph, Catholic Daughters of America at the 38th annual banquet of the organization at the Baron Steuben Hotel Sunday evening.

"If you take tolerance to mean merely putting up with one another, then we are called upon to show more than tolerance. It is not a compliment to be merely tolerated as an odd character in a neighborhood is tolerated. That is not the kind of tolerance which good Catholics should either give or receive. It falls far short of the Christian love which should be a full-time aim of all our living," said Father Ehmann. Following his talk Father Ehmann was heard in several piano selections.

OTHERS ON THE program were Mrs. Fred Hamilton who sang and Mrs. Julia Carlton who gave two humorous readings. Mrs. Hamilton was accompanied by Mrs. T. J. Hart. Mrs. Reynolds Everett played for group singing.

National Church Paper Cites Elmira School

The new model church and school building of St. Anthony's Parish, Elmira, which replaced the structures destroyed two years ago by fire, is featured in an article in the current issue of the national publication "Church Property Administration."

In a complete editorial and pictorial layout, the magazine describes the combination school and chapel building. The full page of pictures includes a view of the buff brick building and scenes photographed in the modern instruction and craft rooms.

A prelude to the article points out that "no modern teaching aid has been overlooked" in the construction of the new St. Anthony's. It is emphasized that the structure, although an immediate necessity for the burned-out parish displays up-to-date ideas and long range planning.

Also highlighted in "Church Property Administration" story is the information that all the furnishings and appointments of the school met the New York State requirements for educational equipment.
