POLES ARREST EIGHT PRIESTS

Warsaw — (RNS) — Eight Polish Catholic priests were arrested in Katowice, western Poland, after they ignored security police warnings and publicly read a pastoral letter written by Bishop Stanley Adamski of Katowice.

Reports reaching here also said that 24 other priests were threatened with arrest.

In his letter, Bishop Adamski warned Catholics to "oppose by peaceful means" any attempt to deprive them of the benefits of religion or religious education.

The letter made no mention of Communists or the Communist-dominated government.

Naval Academy Catholics Take Communion

Annapolis — (NC) — Almost the entire body of 700 Catholic midshipmen at the U. S. Naval Academy here attended Mass and received Communion at the second annual Communion Mass for Catholic midshipmen.

Archbishop Francis P. Keough of Baltimore preached the sermon at the Mass. The Mass, held each year on Washington's birthday, was celebrated in the academy chapel by the Rev. John F. Huges, deputy chief of navy chaplains. It was arranged by the Rev. Henry J. Rotzke, Catholic chaplain at the academy.

It is implied, and is asserted by many doctors, euthanasia is practiced by them, is it not better that it should be sanctioned by law, brought out into the open and subjected to a legal and moral scrutiny, rather than carried out secretly, surreptitiously and without regulation?

It does not seem fair that a physician, in doing what his conscience dictates, should lay himself open to criminal prosecution, nor say that "his supreme matter" should be left entirely to the discretion of one individual.

The proposed measure would be for the good of the attending physician as well as of the in-suffering patient.

MRS. ROBERTSON JONES, Executive Vice President

Mrs. Jones' letter is interesting in that it indicates that she may be among the Courier-Journal's select reading public.

More significant is Mrs. Jones' insistent claim that "many doctors" at their own discretion secretly practice mercy killing. This charge is being given strong emphasis in all euthanasia propaganda.

It is a very serious charge. It is supported to some extent by the fact that a number of doctors are publicly associated with the Euthanasia Society. The Society also claims that its Committee of Physicians now includes 175 members.

There is a real danger that constant repetition of the charge that "many doctors" practice mercy-killing at their own discretion will lead to public hysteria and widespread popular distrust of the medical profession.

THE GENERAL public can only be appalled by the realization that there are doctors who are secret killers, as the Euthanasia Society asserts.

The solution proposed by Mrs. Jones and the Euthanasia Society is to legalize mercy-killing. But this is no solution at all. This would only increase the danger of public fear and completely shatter the public's traditional confidence in the medical profession.

In view of Mrs. Jones' charge that many doctors are secret killers we offer another solution. Every state should pass a law obligating all doctors with Euthanasia sympathies to register the fact on their shingles, their advertisements, and even on their telephone listings. This is the very least that we can do to protect the public against a situation which the Euthanasia Society says exists.

We can hope, too, that those doctors who are faithful to the best traditions of their profession and their noble vocation of preserving life will take some effective steps to counter the public fear which Euthanasia propaganda tends to create against doctors generally.

AMERICAN DOCTORS are currently campaigning to defeat certain social-economic proposals such as socialized medicine and compulsory health insurance. In these proposed measures the doctors see the threat of socialism.

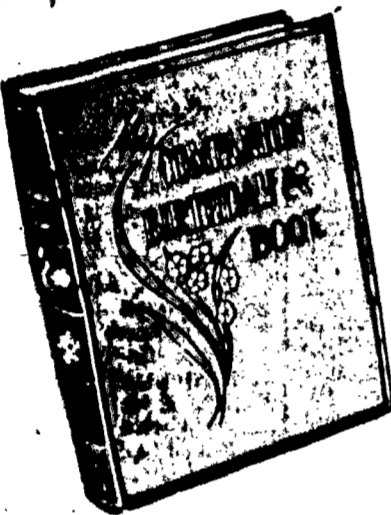
If the doctors are sincere in their fight against socialism they will not overlook the proposal to legalize mercy-killing. This proposal is unmistakably socialist in that it gives the state unwarranted rights over man's most precious possession — his life.

Doctors, if we want to fight socialism, let us look at what the Euthanasia Society proposes. Let us see if we are not secretly being led into a snare.

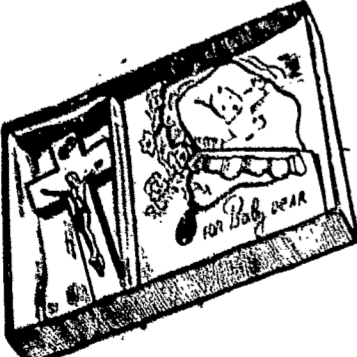

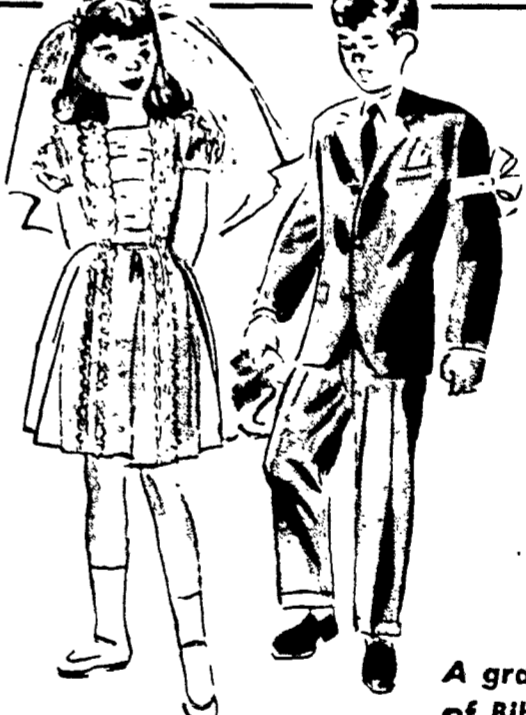
