### Christian Solidarity Alone Can Stem Red Tide, Avers Hungarian Lecturer

Communism's massive movement toward world domination can be halted only by a united Christianity, a "show of superior force" and a rededication to the traditional philosophy of freedom so well-guarded in America. This was the contention of Dr. Tibor Eckhardt, former president of the Hungarian Shareholders Party, who spoke Sunday night at the final in the current Aquinas Christian Culture Lecture Series.

Declaring that "the momentous victory of the Allies in World War-III has changed in three years to outright political defeat," the former Hungarian statesman and close friend of Josef Cardinal Mindszenty asserted:

"The Cardinal's trial and imprisonment have served to make the world at least realize what danger we really are facing. The situation is deteriorating rapidly and we are facing the horrible menace of a Third World War. Political responsibility for these events, at least by default, must be attributed to the Western World."

HOW FAR THE Russians will go, Dr. Eckhardt said, "depends on world opinion." They believe, he added, that "it is a virtue not to keep their promises; against this philosophy only a devotion to the traditions of freedom can prevail."

Peoples of the satellite nations, he stressed, are not responsible for what has occurred. Only a small minority in these nations are Communists, he noted. If free elections were held, the Reds would be ousted by tremendous majorities, "but there is no chance that the people will be able to overthrow the governments as long as the Communists hold power."

"Actually," he said, "there are fewer Communists in Hungary than in America. If war should come, and a friendly army were near their borders, the Hungarians would flock to the side of the Allied cause en masse."

There will be no successful uprising from within, Dr. Eckhardt believes, "because since the days of the machine gun no power can be destroyed by an unarmed, persecuted people inside. And you can't join a distant army by telephoning."

The speaker said the Russians consider the Catholic Church as "their Number One Enemy," and described Cardinal Mindszenty as "the spiritual leader and hero of the entire Hungarian nation."

THE RUSSIANS COULD have silenced the Cardinal, Dr. Eckhardt said, as they did so many hundreds of other clerics whom they effectively eliminated without so much as a mock trial. Apparently they felt that they must make an example of the prelate who was so admired by the people.

"They wanted to present the Cardinal as a broken man. And they wanted to take occasion further to besmirch the good name of the United States, which the Cardinal recently visited."

Through whatever process of torture they employed, he continued, they forced an ignominious confession from a man "who was not the same personality we had known."

Early Christians, he recalled, "were thrown to the beasts and went down to glorious martyrdom. Communists deprive modern martyrs of the glory of martyrdom. Before killing, they vilify and degrade the victim."

DR. ECKHART DESCRIBED and discounted in detail each "charge" against the Cardinal. Referring to the so-called "Yellow Book" said by the Reds to contain the written "confessions," the speaker said he had examined four pages of it and noted 50 errors of grammar. "It seems obvious," he concluded, "that no treatment, other drugs, shock or exhaustion, was employed."

Dr. Eckhardt further declared that an escaped Russian officer testified under oath in Vienna that Cardinal Mindszenty was questioned for 82 hours without being allowed to sit down, and then served some "refreshing drugs."

According to Dr. Eckhardt, many Hungarians know from experience that these drugs destroy the will power while leaving memory and intelligence only slightly affected.

The current Russian coin, the speaker stated symbolically, has Karl Marx on one side and Genghis Khan on the other. He said the Russians prepare their procedure against a victim well in advance. Just like a Hollywood production, with story, script, villain, witnesses and cast very well rehearsed.

Currently on a lecture tour across the country, Dr. Eckhardt is considering a European trip next Spring to consult with a national Hungarian committee working with refugees. He was introduced by the Rev. Hugh Haffey, director of the League Series.

### Aquinas Students Reenact President's Inauguration

President Truman, impersonated by Joseph Roberts, was elaborately re-inaugurated at a mock ceremony in Aquinas Institute Friday afternoon produced by the Aquinas History Club in cooperation with Nazareth Academy.

A throng of 1,200 students joined in the inaugural and lent their voices to a loud cheer as their President was sworn in by Chief Justice Virson, alias Edward Dakin. The oath was read by Thomas Green, who represented Justice Stanley F. Reed.

The ceremony took place on a flag-draped stand against a background scene of the Capitol Building. On the podium with Roberts was John Sours, as Vice-president Alvan Barkley. Gertrude Cellura played Margaret Truman and Mrs. Truman was enacted by Catherine Lawrence. Barkley's family was represented by his daughter, impersonated by Eleanor Chambers.

Color for the scene was supplied by delegations of state dignitaries, congressmen and foreign ambassadors, all attired in costumes designed to proclaim their positions. More than 170 pupils took part in producing the inauguration.

A 20-piece band blared the traditional "Hail to the Chief" and marched through the aisles of the auditorium during the ceremony. The backdrop of the Capitol Building, which was painted by Donald Rider and James Krelg, extended the full length of the stage and a huge model of the "Ship of State" was carried in procession. An inaugural ball was held in the evening.
