### Bishop Buddy's Leadership Set For Fatima Pilgrimage

The International Catholic Travel Service in Washington, D. C. has announced that the National Pilgrimage of Reparation to Fatima, next August will be under the leadership of His Excellency, the Most Rev. Charles F. Buddy, Bishop of San Diego, California. The Rev. Joseph A. Cirincione, pastor of St. Francis of Assisi Church, will be Spiritual Director.

The pilgrims going by air will leave New York August 6, arriving in Lisbon the next day. They will be at Fatima for three days, participating in the annual pilgrimage of the Diocese of Leiria there on August 13.

They will then fly from Lisbon to Lourdes and spend five days in the Eternal City visiting its famous churches, basilicas, and museums and will be received in audience by His Holiness, Pope Pius XII.

They will leave Rome by rail on August 22, stopping at Florence, Nice and Avignon before reaching Lourdes where they will participate in special devotions at that world famous shrine on August 28 and 29. From Lourdes they will go to Paris where several days will be spent in sight seeing.

The bulk of the pilgrims will return from Paris by air arriving in New York on Sept. 3. Those who desire can make special arrangements to visit England or Ireland before returning.

The entire cost of the pilgrimage will be \$1193.00 by air. It is slightly higher for those who go by sea. The International Catholic Travel Service is represented in upper New York State by Joseph W. Benn, 782 Main St. W. Rochester 11, N. Y.

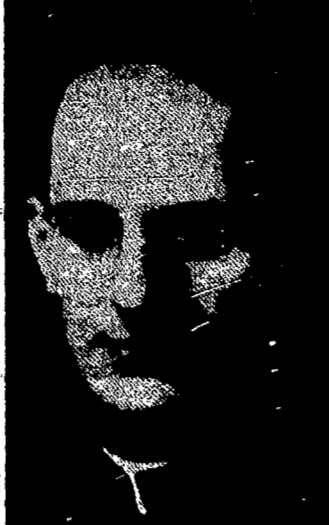

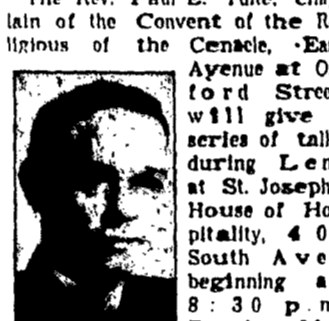
### Hospitalers To Hear Fr. Tuite

### School Bus Law Urged for Iowa

Dr. Molina, Ia. (RNS) - Legislative approval of a law to allow private school pupils to ride in public school buses is being sought here by a former Iowa state representative.
