**Charles A. Claus, Organist, Rites At Holy Family**

Solemn Requiem Mass for Charles A. Claus, 57, who died Mar. 1, 1946 in St. Mary's Hospital, was offered Friday morning, Mar. 4, 1949 in Holy Family Church. Mr. Claus had been organist in the parish for 26 years.

A GRADUATE of Holy Family School, Mr. Claus attended the Flo Nono College Conservatory of Music at Milwaukee, Wis. When he returned from the conservatory in 1910, he became organist at Holy Family. Noted for his many charitable deeds, Mr. Claus gave a helping hand to many young musicians and taught music gratis to talented youngsters. He was a member of the Holy Family Holy Name Society.

Surviving are his wife, Bertha Schiffer Claus, three sons, Dr. Carl J. Claus of the University of Minnesota's chemical research staff, S. J. Raymond A. Claus and William J. Claus; five daughters, Mrs. Joseph Roth, Mrs. Robert McElligott, Mrs. Henry Van Apeldorn, Joan and Kathleen Claus; one sister, Mrs. Frank Yauch, and two grandchildren.

**Rites Held For William Gragen**

Funeral of William H. Gragen, 85, veteran Rochester newspaperman and a trustee and life-long member of Immaculate Conception Parish, was held Saturday, March 5, 1949 in Immaculate Conception Church. Mr. Gragen died Wednesday, Mar. 2, 1949 at his home, 483 Mt. Hope Ave.

MR. GRAGEN DIED with a few days of observing his 70th year in the newspaper business. Active right up until his fatal illness, he had spent a full and varied career as printer, composing room foreman, advertising salesman, Civil Service commissioner and Democratic leader.

Born in Rochester, Mr. Gragen went to Immaculate Conception School and the old Vosburgh Academy. On his 16th birthday he started work as an employee of the old Express. In later years he worked at the old Union and Advertiser, the Post Express and the Daily Record.

He had been a member of the Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus and served as district marshal of the K of C. Fourth Degree, under the late William Connor, master for 37 years, he was a member of the Protectives and held the title "Daddy of the Buckets," a soubriquet given to their oldest members.

Widely acquainted, Mr. Gragen was noted for his good memory of many friends' birthdays and anniversaries for which they never lacked congratulations. He lived for 43 years in the house on Mt. Hope Ave. He never married. His sister, Miss Mary E. Gragen had lived with him for many years. She is the only survivor.

**Marriage Course Closing To Present Father Tormey**

Sixth and final in a series of Pre-Cana Conferences—a marriage course for engaged and newly-wedded persons—will be held at 8:15 p. m. Monday in Columbus Civic Centre ballroom.

Spiritual aspects of the marriage bond will be discussed by the Rev. Richard T. Tormey, associate editor of the Catholic Courier-Journal, whose topic will be, "And This is a Great Sacrament."

The Rev. Albert J. Shamon, moderator of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, announced that as a fitting climax to the series there will be Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and a recitation of the marriage vows.

MORE THAN 200 persons, largest attendance of the series, heard last Monday's two speakers—the Rev. Francis E. Hester, assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church, who talked on "The Soul of Marriage," and Dr. William L. Madden of Strong Memorial Hospital staff, whose subject was "The Physiology of Marriage."

Pointing out that marriage is "a sacramental contract," Father Hester stressed that it binds both parties "perpetually and exclusively." He emphasized that the laws against divorce and birth control are Divine laws and not merely Church laws, and that they who criticize the Church for these laws fail to recognize that the Church is the mouthpiece of God on earth.

**James H. Martin Funeral Held**

Funeral services for James H. Martin, 90, who died Mar. 2, 1949, at his home, 500 Genesee St., were conducted in St. Peter and Paul's Church Saturday, Mar. 5, 1949.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Donald E. Lux, assisted by the Rev. Robert L. Kress, deacon, and the Rev. Charles Connell, subdeacon, the Very Rev. John S. Randall was in the sanctuary.

Known as Rochester's "Police-man No. 1," Martin had been assigned to the City Hall for 34 years and served as bodyguard to six Rochester mayors and two city managers. He was the oldest member of the force in point of service.

A POLICEMAN SINCE June 29, 1891, his first duty was in the Weighlock district in South Avenue. He was later transferred to the Four Corners and in 1904 was appointed to the City Hall post, which he filled until his retirement in May, 1938.

He was a member of the Locust Club, the Police Benevolent Association, the Police Veterans and the Police Holy Name Society.

He is survived by his wife, Catherine Roth Martin with whom he celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in January, 1944; two sons, Detective J. James Martin and Frederick J. Martin; a daughter, Ruth A. Martin; several nieces and nephews.
