## School Board Backs Bill on Red Teachers

New York — (NC) — A bill introduced in the State Assembly barring school teachers who are communist party members has been approved by the New York City Board of Education, after noisy disapproval by communist party members and the New York Teachers Union (CIO).  
The bill provides that "any person who is a member of the communist party or who refuses to disclose upon inquiry whether or not he is a member of the party, or who subscribes to its doctrine, or who espouses or is in sympathy with its cause, shall be ineligible for employment in the teaching profession or in the school systems of the State."  
The Board of Education recommended only one change in the bill, that the phrase "... or who espouses or is in sympathy with its cause" be deleted.  
The American Civil Liberties Union also opposed the bill at a meeting of 200 persons, many of whom loudly applauded statements of the Teachers Union and the communists.

The four members of the parish who gave their lives were William E. Peshon, Joseph J. Hoodak, Andrew Macekur and Nicholas M. Ruzczak.

Father Lane urged the members of the Catholic War Veterans to rededicate themselves to the primary objective of the organization, namely, to combat Communism and explained that those ideals were more urgently needed today than at any time since the founding of the organization.

## Germany in Need of Priests, Says Prelate

Frankfurt — (NC) — The need of priests throughout the diaspora districts of Germany continues to be so great that one prelate pleaded "Send us priests for five years from now there won't be any Catholics if we don't provide for them now."  
There are more than 3,500,000 Catholics among the refugees from the East, who have settled in districts formerly predominantly Protestant. Only some 1,200 priests came with them. In the Magdeburg district, 49 out of 253 parishes have no priest or chaplain, where they can see the Blessed Sacrament about 700 Protestant churches are being used for Catholic services.
