Medieval Church in Italy Is Restored

Rome—(NC)—The medieval church of the Knights Templar in Perugia, which had been closed to liturgical functions since 1876, has been restored for religious worship.

The church, believed to date back to the twelfth century, was closed when the local commune took possession of it in 1876. It was first used as a dog kennel, then as a refuge for stray animals, later as a mule stable and then as a storehouse for lumber, scrap iron and other construction material.

The reconstruction work brought to light the existence of several paintings in the church, among them that of a monk treating the paw of an animal.
