His Eminence Samuel Cardinal Stritch was the consecrating prelate for the first ceremony of its kind ever televised.

The three elevated to the episcopacy in solemn ceremonies at Holy Name Cathedral were the Most Rev. Martin D. McNamara, first Bishop of the new diocese of Joliet, Ill.; the Most Rev. William E. Cousins, auxiliary Bishop of Chicago; and the Most Rev. William A. O'Connor of Springfield, Illinois.

Television sets were put up in each of the 450 schools of the Chicago archdiocese where pupils and their parents witnessed the Cathedral ceremonies. In addition, the event was televised throughout the Middle West and the East by the National Broadcasting company.

The ceremony was received with excellent clarity on television sets in Rochester and surrounding communities by pickup from the Buffalo TV station.

Jesuit Martyrs' Tercentenary Set

Midland, Ont. — (NC) — At the direction of the Canadian Hierarchy, celebrations will be staged all over Canada this year marking the tercentenary of four of the Eight Jesuit North American Martyrs slain by the Iroquois in 1649.

The Saints who will be honored are John de Brebeuf and Gabriel Lalemant, who are buried at Martyrs' Shrine near here and Charles Garnier and Noel Chabanel.

In 1940 the Jesuit Martyrs were named by Pope Pius XII as secondary patrons of Canada.

His Eminence James Cardinal McGuigan, Archbishop of Toronto, has approved a solemn religious service at Martyrs' Shrine on July 31, Feast of St. Ignatius, founder of the Jesuits, and a Pontifical Mass in St. Michael's Cathedral at Toronto, on September 25.

Also planned is a pageant, written and staged by the Rev. Daniel Lord, S.J., to be presented at Martyrs' Shrine in July and in Toronto several weeks later.

Papal Film Show Marking Jubilee Set For Schools

New York — (NC) — To commemorate two anniversaries of His Holiness Pope Pius XII, the Catholic Film and Radio Guild has prepared a special motion picture program for the use of Catholic groups throughout the country according to Daniel E. Doran, guild executive chairman. The year 1949 marks the golden anniversary of the ordination of Pope Pius XII, and the tenth anniversary of his coronation.

The film program includes four Catholic religious productions: "Coronation of Pope Pius XII," showing the impressive ceremonies, as well as pictures taken during the Pope's visit, as Cardinal Pacelli to the United States; "The Vatican of Pius XII," a March of Time production depicting activities of the Vatican; "Through the Centuries," a full-length feature written by the Rev. Francis X. Talbot, S.J. which embraces the history of the Catholic Church from the time of Christ and shows the work of priests and monks throughout the world; and "Ave Maria," a visit to the beautiful edifice of Our Lady of Chartres with appropriate background music.

The films are 16 mm sound and are mounted on two reels for showing in parish halls or schools.

2,500 Iron Curtain Refugees Stranded, Homeless, in China

Shanghai — (NC) — About 2,500 stateless persons, who had been promised evacuation are stranded in Shanghai. They are Russians and other Slavs from countries behind the Iron Curtain who had found refuge in China so far and now cannot find refuge anywhere else.

In the past they have known persecution or fled in fear before it. As the situation in China deteriorates their enduring fear is intensified. They are pathetically anxious to move anywhere else in the world but the world's doors have been slammed shut in their faces.

ONE EXCEPTION is the war-ravaged Philippine Republic which has offered temporary haven to these White Russians and other stateless refugees at an emergency camp on the island of Samar.

Already the International Refugee Organization has evacuated 4,000 to Samar and maintains them camp. But the IRO agreement with the Philippines is for a four month period only. Within that time IRO hoped to find openings for permanent resettlement of these people in some of the world's less handicapped countries.

Because no government not even members of the IRO has yet agreed to accept any of these refugees, IRO has halted all further evacuation from China to Samar. That leaves the 2,500, more than one-third of China's White Russians and other stateless persons, in a shocking limbo. About 1,000 of the number now on Samar and still here are Catholics.

"THESE POOR people are in a pitiable plight," said the Rev. Frederick McGuire, C.M., of Brooklyn, executive secretary of the Catholic Welfare Committee here and representative in China for NCVW War Relief Services.

"They had already sold their belongings at a sacrifice, quit their jobs and given up their homes expecting to depart for Samar. The IRO decision made in Geneva comes as a bewildering blow. IRO headquarters feels it cannot move any more to the Philippines until some place is found to resettle permanently those already there. So far no country, big or small, is willing to take even some of these refugees."
