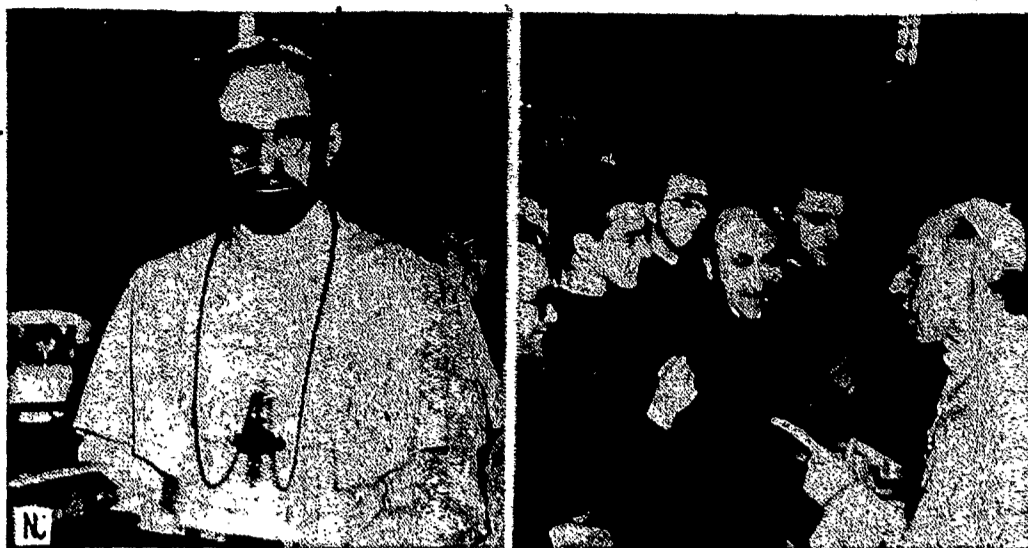
**Second Honor  
Recorded Negro  
Woman's Work**

Lake Charles La.—(NC)—  
At ceremonies in Sacred Heart  
of Jesus Church, when Bish-  
op Jules E. Jeannard of  
Lafayette conferred the Papal  
medal Pro Ecclesia et Ponti-  
fice upon Miss Eleanor Figaro,  
it was announced that another  
honor is to be accorded her.

Miss Figaro, as far as is  
known, is the first Negro  
woman in the South to receive  
such a Papal decoration. The  
other honor was announced by  
the Rev. Edward J. Rechten-  
wald, S.S.J., pastor of the  
church, who said that a new  
school gymnasium, for which  
funds now are being collected,  
will be dedicated in her honor.

Bishop Jeannard, after bless-  
ing and conferring the medal,  
praised the work of Miss Fi-  
garo, who has instructed chil-  
dren in catechism, influenced  
fallen-away Negro Catholics to  
return to the Faith, served as  
parish organist.

**New Church Being Erected  
As Memorial in Hiroshima**

New York — (RNS) — A Roman Catholic church is  
now under construction in Hiroshima, Japan, as a memorial  
to those who died in the atom bombing of that city, it was  
announced at the Jesuit Mis-  
sions office here.

Plans call for the church to  
open its doors on Aug. 6, 1950,  
the fifth anniversary of the  
atom bombing, the announce-  
ment said. Elaborate services  
are being planned for the ded-  
ication, which will be attended by  
high civil and church dignitaries  
from all parts of Japan.

THE CHURCH will be the  
first unit in a Hiroshima civic  
memorial which will ultimately  
include five other buildings to

be used for social and church  
purposes.  
Father Hugo Lassalle, S. J.,  
superior of the Jesuit mission in  
Hiroshima when the bomb fell,  
and originator of the memorial  
plan, hopes to have sufficient  
funds to lay the cornerstone of  
one of these other five buildings  
during observances commemor-  
ating the 40th anniversary of  
the landing in Japan of St. Fran-  
ciscus Xavier, which will take place  
in May.

The memorial is being con-  
structed with the assistance of  
an anonymous American bene-  
factor who has donated \$50,000  
to erect the church.

Bill to Bar Reds  
Albany, N. Y. — (NC) — A  
measure which would bar Com-  
munist Party members from  
holding civil service jobs or  
teaching positions has been ap-  
proved by the State Assembly  
by a vote of 148 to 2 and now  
goes to the Senate. The mea-  
sure was introduced by Assem-  
blyman Frank J. McMullen, of  
Brooklyn.

Theology Review**
