**Protestants' Film Library Shames Small Catholic List**

New York—(NC)—Catholics in the United States last year produced only one religious motion picture—a 30-minute short subject—while non-Catholics made 28, according to R. C. Bolton, secretary of the executive committee of The Catholic Film and Radio Guild, in his annual report.

"Few Catholics realize," said Mr. Bolton, "the useful position in which the Church stands today in regard to films. For example, more than 400 motion pictures are now being shown regularly in Protestant churches, Sunday schools and church halls.

In comparison, there are less than 15 worth-while religious feature films with English dialogue available to our Catholic people.

"Let me cite another point. Protestant churches today possess many fine films for use in this country, showing the need for the establishment of missions, as well as a substantial library of films for the use of missionaries throughout the world.

**'Lady of Fatima' Play Opening April 3 at Mercy High Evokes Diocesanwide Interest**

Reservations for the play, "Lady of Fatima," from cities and villages throughout the Rochester Diocese this week indicated a mounting diocesanwide interest in the dramatic story of Our Lady's apparitions opening Sunday, Apr. 3, in Mercy High School Auditorium, Blossom Road, Rochester.

Approximately 10,000 persons are expected to witness the performances, to be staged for seven nights from Apr. 3 through Sunday, Apr. 9.

TALENTED DRAMATIC artists many of whom have had experience in community theater groups, will enact the thrilling story of the Blessed Mother's six appearances to the three little children at Fatima, Portugal in 1917. Especially effective is the scene depicting the Miracle of the Sun.

Among novelties in the production is "a play within a play" to be presented by a group of characters on a separate stage which is being added to the regular auditorium stage.

The Rev. Urban Nagle, O.P., of New York City, Dominican author of "Lady of Fatima," will arrive in Rochester next Tuesday to assist at dress rehearsals.

**Network Programs To Push Bishops' Overseas Relief**

Two special radio shows, featuring movie and stage headliners, will be broadcast Saturday evening, Mar. 26 to dramatize European family needs in preparation for nationwide church collections scheduled Sunday, Mar. 27 for overseas relief.

A program from Hollywood will publicize the Catholic Bishops' Relief Fund with Pat O'Brien, J. Carroll Nash, and a cast of other motion picture stars.

The story, "Joseph's Coat," will be heard on Station WARC Saturday evening from 7:30 to 8 o'clock.

1024 stations of major networks will carry "One Great Hour," starring Hollywood and Broadway actors later on Saturday night from 10 to 11 p.m. Interfaith cooperation on a large scale to raise the \$10,000,000 goal of Sunday's relief fund collection will be highlighted.

Featuring a short talk by President Harry S. Truman and dramatic offerings by Gregory Peck, Ida Lupino and Robert Montgomery, the program will urge church attendances on Mar. 27 and generous church offerings.

Three Rochester stations, WARC, WVEW and WHEC will broadcast the program plus WICU, Ithaca, WUGA, Geneva, and WMBD, Auburn.

**THE CHURCH of the Air** program for Sunday will broadcast an address by the Very Rev. Msgr. John J. Carberry, an official of the Tribunal of the Brooklyn Diocesan Court. His talk "The Secret of Prayer" will be heard locally on WHEC, Rochester, and WICU, Ithaca. The CBS mixed cast will provide devotional music.

**THE QUESTION** "Why do girls enter the convent?" one of the most intriguing mysteries of Catholic life, will be treated on the St. Francis Hour Sunday at 6:30 p. m. on WSAV. As the narrator explains the "mystery of J. Carroll Nash Sister Marie" to a puzzled high school girl, he reveals the steps which led Peggy Allen from her comfortable home and a pleasant job into the convent of a teaching order.

**A FORMER** Air Corps Chaplain in the Pacific, the Rev. John Muldoon, ABC Hour of Faith speaker, will discuss "The New War" Sunday, Mar. 27 at 11:30 a.m. on WARC. Theme of Father Muldoon's series is the waging of war against sin by prayer.

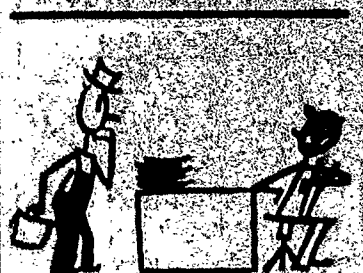
