spoke Tuesday at a dinner for Holy Name officers and 'Fatima' ticket chairmen. He congratulated the Diocesan Holy Name Union for undertaking "to spread the message of Our Lady."

Father Nagle was high in praise of the 40-member cast, which is under the direction of Wilfred Scott, veteran local dramatist and director of Holy Redeemer Dramatic Club.

"THEY HAVE captured the spirit of the message of Fatima," the priest declared. "They are doing the parts excellently and their performances are bound to reach the audiences with dramatic effect."

Father Nagle is fresh from a new theatrical triumph on Broadway. His "City of Kings," a play about Blessed Martin de Porres, opened one month ago and received enormous acclaim from most of the critics in the metropolis. It seems destined for an extended run.

During his stay here Father spoke on drama and speech before several college, high school and other groups.

Father Nagle, who is the founder and director of the Blackfriars Guild, was ordained at Catholic University in 1931. He has traveled extensively through Europe, and only recently visited Fatima, Portugal. While there he interviewed relatives of Lucy, only survivor of the three children to whom Our Lady appeared. Lucy now is in a Carmelite community. His "Lady of Fatima" play is the result of this visit.

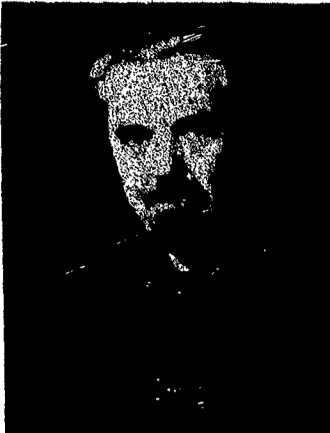

Prelate, Foe Of Reds, To Lecture Sunday

Msgr. Mykolas Krupavicius, head of a Lithuanian underground resistance movement, will describe conditions in Europe and his native land with particular reference to Communist influence in an address at St. George's hall, Hudson and Weeger, Sunday.

Msgr. Krupavicius will say Mass in the Lithuanian church in the morning and preach at the 8 and 11 o'clock Masses. His lecture is scheduled at 3 p. m.

FOUNDER OF THE Christian Democratic Party in Lithuania in 1917. Msgr. Krupavicius was once condemned to death by the Bolsheviks during the revolution and once in absentia by the Soviets in 1946. He is now chairman of the Supreme Lithuanian Committee of Liberation, which represents a coalition of the political parties and underground combat organizations, with the exception of the Communists.

One of the authors of the Constitution of Lithuania and the Agrarian Reform Act, he held the post of Minister of Agriculture in various cabinets. During the late war, the Lithuanian prelate was seized by the Germans after protesting against the extermination of the Lithuanian Jews and the deportation of native farmers. He was liberated from Nazi prisons by the American troops in 1945.

He arrived in America with Vacys Sidzkauskas at Idlewild airport Jan. 27 from Paris.
