British Radio Talks Help Nationwide Convert Drive

New York—(NC)—The unlimited potential of radio as a means of presenting Catholic thought to non-Catholics was outlined by the Rev. Angelus Andrew, O.F.M., director of Catholic broadcasting for the British Broadcasting Corporation, at a meeting of the Catholic Interracial Forum here.

Father Andrew, who has held the BBC post for the last five years, said that in England the radio is "the most important and effective agency in the apostolate field, a splendid agency for laying the ground work for a new wave of Catholic evangelism."

"OUR BIGGEST PROBLEM," he said, "is getting across to non-Catholics the elementary

fact that we're sound human beings, that we're friendly, Christlike, and the radio gives us this opportunity. When the psychological barriers of ignorance, bigotry and the sense of fear directed against Catholics are overcome, then and only then will our mission in the broadcasting field have been successful."

Father Andrew, who is in this country on a three-month preaching and lecturing visit and currently is stationed at Corpus Christi Church here, said that prior to 1944 there was no Catholic representative on the BBC staff.

He said that although the word "Rome" is still "a sinister one to English non-Catholics," experience has shown astonishing success with broadcasts. Catholic speakers and programs alike leave a favorable impression," he declared. He said the BBC has begun to broadcast the Mass three or four times a year for the benefit of invalids.

"ON THE GROUND" that Catholic needs are adequately cared for," he continued, "the Catholic broadcast for BBC" deliberately bypass members of our own Faith in their programs, and try to reach those outside the Church, particularly those not attached to any church."

He said that a survey has shown that not more than 5,000,000 persons in England are Catholic, while between 14,000,000 and 16,000,000 listen to religious broadcasts on Sundays. He said "We broadcast primarily to the millions who do not attend church."

US Aide Named to German Radio Job

Washington—(NC)—Martin H. Work, program director of the National Catholic Community Service, has been appointed consultant to the Office of Military Government in the U. S. Zone in Germany where he will work with the educational and cultural division on a special radio and religion project. Mr. Work will leave for Germany on April 1 on a three-month assignment.

Purpose of the project is to survey available resources and study conditions affecting current religious broadcasts in Germany so recommendations can be made for improving and expanding the use of radio in bringing religion to the German people.

Mr. Work will consult with German radio and religious leaders, conduct seminars on radio for religious leaders, and set up the framework for holding zone conferences in radio and religion.

He will discuss the possibilities of the building of a radio station in the zone, and will be the hostess for the evening program on WNET (WVA) WMBR at 9:30 p. m. Wednesday evening.

Movie of War-Torn Europe Set for Apr. 5, at Eastman

The hard facts of life for the peoples who exist behind the Iron Curtain will be brought to Rochester by one of the world's foremost documentary photographers, Julien Bryan, in a color film to be shown at the Eastman Theater Tuesday, Apr. 5, at 8:15 p. m. under the sponsorship of the Rochester Association for the United Nations.

Bryan, who spent three months photographing people, cities and farms in Austria, Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia and Hungary will show life as he found it last summer in those countries torn by the tragedies of war and postwar events.

IN ORDER TO FILM the lives of all the 11 million displaced persons of Europe, he lived among them for months, eating their kind of food and sleeping in barracks and railroad cars. In all his sequences, beginning with Poland and continuing through Germany, Austria and other war damaged lands, he shows close-ups as well as crowd shots of the people.

His experiences of the past are repeated in Rochester, some of the faces on the screen will be recognized by relatives here, Bryan predicts.

The work of the great American relief agencies, including the Catholic Charities, in the camps for displaced persons, will also be shown. Bryan shows the miseries of refugees, Yugoslavs, Russians, Poles, Czechs, Hungarians struggling in those camps to find life again.

The movie, entitled "Europe Rebuilds," begins in Warsaw, and moves Westward to a dramatic climax where several hundred refugees are being selected by governments of Canada and Venezuela for a new life in a new world. The picture closes with a challenge to Americans to do the most they can for the toughest of all relief problems, the displaced persons.

Screen Star Wins Catholic Honor For Faith and Talent

Notre Dame, Ind.—Irene Dunne, motion-picture actress, was announced this week as the 1949 recipient of the Laetare Medal, awarded annually since 1888 by the University of Notre Dame to the outstanding member of the Roman Catholic laity in the United States.

The announcement was made by the Rev. John J. Cavanaugh, C. S. C., president of Notre Dame, who said that Miss Dunne was "an example of talented Christian womanhood in a profession and community unfortunately publicized for the briefness of marriages and careers."

THE LAETARE Medal, oldest American Catholic medal, gets its name from the fact it is awarded annually on Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday in Lent. It was instituted by the Rev. Edward F. Sorin, C. S. C., founder of the University of Notre Dame.

Miss Dunne is the sixty-sixth recipient. To date, fifty-one men and fourteen women had been honored by the award.

"She has never subordinated her conscience to her art," Father Cavanaugh said, "but from the outset of her career has insisted upon wholesome pictures."

"Throughout fifteen years as a top-ranking star, she has remained an exemplary wife and mother while winning the admiration and respect of high and low in the film industry and in the world at large."

Miss Dunne was born in Louisville, Ky., Dec. 20, 1904, and in 1927, became the wife of Dr. Francis Dennis Griffin, a New York dentist. They have an adopted daughter, Mary Frances. She was nominated five times for the Motion Picture Academy Award. Last year, she received the American Brotherhood Award For Distinguished Service from the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

THE AMERICAN Mothers Committee of the Golden Rule Foundation hailed her as having given the "most outstanding portrayal of a mother on the American screen by an American actress in 1948," as a result of her leading role in the film production, "I Remember Mama."

Miss Dunne is chairman of the Field Army American Cancer Society, co-chairman with Harold Stassen of the American Heart Association and co-chairman with E. Roland Harriman of the American Red Cross.
