

Anglican Paper Lauds Cardinal

London — (CIP) — "We speak for the vast majority of Anglicans, when we express our sympathy with our Roman Catholic brethren at a time when injustice and barbarity has been inflicted on a Prince of the Church," the "Church Times", one of the principal weekly newspapers of the Church of England declared February 11, in a comment on the sentence of Cardinal Mindszenty.

"We await with attention any pronouncement which may be made by the Pope. We desire to put on record our admiration for the courage with which the Roman Catholics of Central Europe are resisting the menace of Marxism at the peril not only of their lives but of their minds.

"Nor is it impertinent to suggest that if the leaders of other non-Roman Christian bodies were to give similar expression to their attitude more would have been achieved towards the unity of Christendom than has been accomplished by all the conferences of the last hundred years."

Priest-Sentenced By Yugoslav Reds

Rome — (RNS) — Don Francesco Zibone, parish priest of Osopo, Yugoslavia, has been sentenced to two months' imprisonment at hard labor for alleged offenses against the Communist controlled Yugoslav regime, according to information here.

Jewish Anti-Red League Disavows Rabbi Wise Attack

New York — (NC) — The attack by Rabbi Stephen S. Wise, American Jewish leader, on the Catholic Church as being "unequivocally for war" was disavowed by the American Jewish League Against Communism, Inc. in a statement sent to Archbishop Patrick A. O'Boyle of Washington, chancellor of the Catholic University of America.

"THE LEAGUE stated that it was 'confident we speak the mind of the vast majority of Americans of the Jewish faith when we apologize for the intemperate statement of Rabbi Stephen S. Wise.' The league said the Wise statement 'was a disservice to interfaith friendship which has been built up laboriously over a period of years by men of good will'.

Rabbi Wise issued his statement on his 75th birthday — St. Patrick's Day — in conjunction with a defense of the Rev. William Howard Melish, Episcopalian clergyman in New York, whose pro-Soviet sympathies have made him a storm center here.

"THE STATEMENT also was denounced as untrue and 'aligned to stir up religious bigotry' by a group of professors of the Catholic University.

(Continued from Page 1) without sufficient clergy are of little use."

The ministers said that they had had assurance from certain Catholic leaders that there was no persecution but the Professor, from his own knowledge, was able to identify these "leaders" as a few priests who had unfortunately associated themselves with the Communist government. The ministers made no attempt to mention the real Catholic leaders, the hierarchy.

The speaker said that he believed that the ministers were permitted to visit not the Archbishop but somebody disguised as him.

"THE PHOTOGRAPH which they brought back showed very unlike Stepinac and it is known on sworn authority that the Yugoslav communists have printed such tricks before."

Archbishop O'Brien pointed out the absurdity of the ministers' claim that they had seen the records of the trial and concluded that they made a true case against the Archbishop.

LOUIS O'BRIEN, of Irish descent and though he bears the name of his great 16th century Irish title of Earl O'Brien of Thomond is actually of Austrian birth having acquired Irish citizenship only lately after he had been deprived of Austrian citizenship by the Nazis in 1940.

The journal of the Austrian Christian Social Party. Now he has returned to the field of teaching and is Research Professor of Political Theories of Mediaeval Times at St. Bonaventure.
