Hungarians Join Tribute to Pope

Buzpest (NC)—Hungarian Catholics joined their brethren around the world in the devout observance of the golden sacerdotal jubilee of His Holiness Pope Pius XII.

Following the exhortations of their Bishops, they offered up prayers and received Holy Communion for the Pope's intentions. Many attended the special Voice Mass priests were privileged to celebrate on Passion Sunday.

THE TEXT of the Apostolic Exhortation, issued by the Supreme Pontiff on February 12 and extending this privilege, was incorporated in a Pastoral issued by Archbishop Josef Groesz of Kalocsa, acting chairman of the Hungarian Board of Bishops, through the Hungarian Courier-Catholic news service.

The pastoral reminded Hungarian Catholics of their duty to act in accordance with this papal exhortation and to follow with filial devotion the Father of Christendom.

MSGR. LADISLAS Pinter, Apostolic Vicar of the Hungarian part of the Diocese of Nagyvad, in a pastoral urging observance of the Holy Father's jubilee, said in part:

"Seven hundred million Catholics will sing the 'Te Deum' on April 3 and the bells ringing from thousands of churches will carry to Rome a salute to Christ's successor on earth. Let us raise high the flags of our

Priest Loses Struggle to Lift Color Ban in Bowling Contest

Atlantic City (INC)—The Rev. Charles Carow, of the Brooklyn Catholic Youth Organization, submitted an amendment to the American Bowling Congress for the third successive year to allow non-white bowlers to compete in the annual ABC tournament.

Although the amendment was defeated by a voice vote, support for the priest's position was greater than in previous years.

FATHER CAROW, who competed here as a member of the New York Bowling Association team, asked for support of his amendment on the grounds of sportsmanship, saying that "the American Bowling Congress is a sports contest. An American champion should be the champion of all the people."

It had been a single handed fight for Father Carow in 1947

and 1948, but his efforts to change the 32-year-old ban were backed by four speakers at the annual ABC convention. The Brooklyn priest then told the delegates that the fight had now entered a stage in which a priest could not become involved. He referred to possible lawsuits, pressure efforts, and incitement of prejudices.

Protestants-United Form State Branches in South

Washington, D. C.—Plans are under way to form throughout the country, state units of Protestants and Other Americans United for Separation of Church and State, it was announced here by Dr. Glenn L. Archer, the group's executive director.

The first state unit was formed in Atlanta, Ga. during March. Dr. Archer said the Georgia unit set a pattern of organization which will be followed by other state groups. A Georgia Advisory Council of some 100 people comprising representatives of the Church, government, education, and laymen's groups, issued a call for an organization meeting. Dr. Archer said.

According to Dr. Archer, a Virginia Protestants United will be formed in Franklin on April 6 and state units will be organized in Cincinnati, Ohio on May 3 and in Birmingham, Alabama, later that month. The national organization of Protestants-United has purchased a new building at 1633 Massachusetts Avenue in Washington, D.C., which will serve as the group's headquarters.

Arab Communists Picket Liege Bishop

Jerusalem (RNS)—Arab Communists picketed at Nazareth against Roman Catholic Bishop Louis J. Kerkhofs of Liege, Belgium, who is in Israel on a relief mission to Arab Christians.

The demonstration, mounted outside the Bishop's headquarters, carried placards which read, "We Don't Want Arms from the Church" and "Do you with Warmongers, Bevin and Leon Blum."
