### Work On New St. Andrew Seminary Site Underway

Construction of the new St. Andrew's Preparatory Seminary building, valued at \$800,000 got underway this week as a giant mechanical shovel began digging operations on the Buffalo Road site.

### Bishop At Rites For Mrs. E. Kane

Mrs. Esther Ulton Kane who died suddenly Thursday morning, March 31, 1949 after an illness of two years was buried on Monday, April 4 at 10 a.m. from the Church of the Blessed Sacrament.

Up to two years ago Mrs. Kane had been Director at St. Elizabeth Guild House for a ten year period.

"During that time she proved herself an extremely able administrator and a person of very high character. She is a loss not only to her family but to the community in general," those associated with her stated.

A solemn Mass of Requiem was sung for her by Rev. Arthur E. Ratigan of the Rochester Catholic Charities Office assisted by the Rev. Edward J. Lintz, Ph.D. of Nazareth College as Dean and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Thomas F. Connors, pastor at Blessed Sacrament as Sub-deacon.

In the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, P.A., V.G., Very Rev. Gerald C. Lambert, Rev. Louis Edelman, William Shannon, John Morgan, Francis Pagan, Thomas Manley and Dr. John Maney.

Most Rev. James E. Keamey, Bishop of Rochester, presided at the Mass, imparted the final blessing and conducted services at the grave assisted by Monsignors Hart, Lambert, Connors and Fathers Ratigan, Lintz and Shannon.

Mrs. Kane is survived by her husband, James P. Kane, and one son, James J. Kane of the Samson College Faculty, one sister, Sister M. Paulette of the Nazareth College Faculty and two grandchildren, Mary Elizabeth and Esther Franca Kane.

Construction of the new minor seminary building was set for the Spring of 1947 in early plans, but fluctuating costs caused the delay in completing the preliminary transactions. Funds were raised in 1946 and amounted to \$352,000.

**THE THREE - STORY** structure, to be located just west of the city line on Buffalo Road, is expected to be completed by September, 1950. Monsignor Lyons announced. All modern and complete facilities will be provided. Joseph P. Flynn is the architect.

Chosen for its proximity to the St. William House, now a student residence for out-of-town seminarians, the site is on a 50-acre plot owned by St. Andrew's. The St. William House will be converted to a faculty house. A convent will occupy the St. Patrick's annex.

Size and cost of the construction project for the new seminary was reduced in comparison with original plans.
