**Bishop Invites Laymen To  
Learn Of Scout Movement**

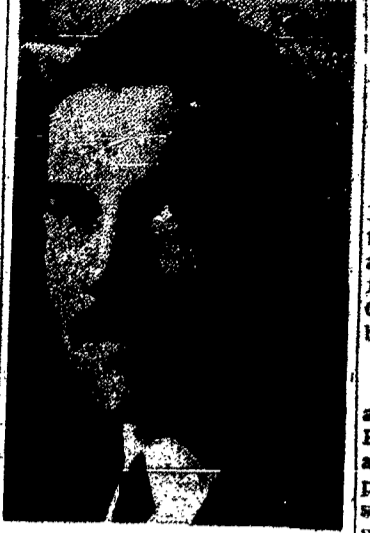
Catholic laymen in the Rochester area have been invited by His Excellency Bishop Kearney to a demonstration and discussion of the Boy Scout movement from 8 to 10 p. m. Tuesday, Apr. 26, in Columbus Civic Centre hall.

Purpose of the meeting, the Bishop's letter pointed out, is to discuss the problem of making available to more Catholic boys the benefits of the Scout movement.

**SHORTAGE OF** trained leaders is the principal reason that hundreds of Catholic boys anxious to become Scouts cannot be enrolled, according to Richard J. Toole, a member of the Diocesan Lay Committee on Scouting and chairman of the committee on recruitment of personnel.

Troop 246 of St. Monica's parish will give a demonstration of various phases of Scout activities. This will be followed by brief descriptions of the duties and responsibilities of the various positions of lay leaders — such as scoutmaster, assistant scoutmaster, troop committee men and the like.

Attendance at the meeting will incur no obligation. It was stressed by Louis A. Langlois, chairman of the Diocesan Lay Committee on Scouting.

**Gift for Pontiff  
Given Bishop By  
Mercy Alumnae**

A check for \$100 was presented to His Excellency Bishop Kearney by the Our Lady of Mercy Alumnae Association to be given to the Holy Father for "any charity he chooses" on the Bishop's "ad limina" visit to Rome next month.

The presentation was made by Miss Marion Byrne, president of the Mercy Alumnae Association, at the annual Communion breakfast last Sunday in Mercy's Cafeteria. Bishop Kearney celebrated Mass in the auditorium.

The Bishop accepted the check as an "act of loyalty to the Holy Father" and congratulated the alumnae on the spirit which prompted their generosity. He said he felt certain the Pontiff would be grateful.

**IN HIS ADDRESS**, the Bishop reminded the more than 300 young women of the symbolical rose which they presented to the Sacred Heart at Mass on the morning of graduation.

"I like to think of that rose as a pledge of loyalty to the Sacred Heart of Jesus," he said, "a token of something left behind in those halls with the ability to bloom and cast a fragrance about, even though the giver is gone."

He warned that "there is a conspiracy of sin and temptation to keep that rose from blooming." The training of Mercy girls to devotion to prayer, purity, honesty and charity and to the Christian point of view is the only safeguard which will keep the rose from withering, he said.
