The "underground Main Street" of Nazareth College campus is becoming an art gallery where a series of large murals depicting the religious history of New York State will brighten the path of students hurrying to classes.

Almost ready for unveiling next month is the second wall painting in a long-term student project to spread a mural-history of Western New York over a 100 foot section of the walls of a tunnel connecting the college Administration Building with St. John Fisher Dormitory.

STUDENTS USE the tunnel for travel from dormitory rooms to classrooms and to meals during all inclement weather.

The new paintings — each 8 feet high and 9 feet wide — planned as an annual gift from the senior class of the college's art department, are expected to bring color as well as historical company into the formerly dark and lonely passage.

Depicting Kateri Takakwita, Mohawk Indian maiden baptized by Jesuit missionaries in 1674 near the present Fonda, N. Y., the newest mural is being painted by Marilyn Metz, senior from Buffalo, under the supervision of Sister Mary de Sales, S.S.J., head of the Art Department and Professor Walter K. Long of Auburn, instructor.

Flanking the Takakwita mural is a painting titled "Totakton" finished last spring by Mary Ellen Treacott and Mary Elizabeth Keegan, graduates of the art course in 1948.

See photo on Page One) "Totakton" an Indian name meaning "at the end of the river" depicts Father Jacques Fremin, S.J. preaching to a group of Seneca Indians at a spot on Honeyoe Creek later called Rochester, Junction near the present Honeyoe Falls.

Father Fremin, a native of Rheims, France, was the first white resident in Monroe County. Coming into Seneca territory from Quebec in the fall of 1668, he lived at Totakton nearly two years as the pastor of La Conception Chapel, reputed by his followers to have been the first building for European purposes in Monroe County.

While in the area Father Fremin built two other chapels, near the present Lima and Holcomb, and then turned over his charge to Father Jean Gagnier in the spring of 1670.
