### Dansville Youths With Kites Await Contest Sunday

Dansville—With final arrangements complete and the selection of the committee accomplished, Henry Thompson and Francis Nagle, co-chairmen, await only good weather to make the kite contest a success next Sunday afternoon, April 24, at the local airport. This contest for the boys and girls of the community is sponsored annually by Boy Scout Troop 38 with the assistance of Dansville Council No. 785, Knights of Columbus.

Norbe Blum, in charge of public relations, has arranged for the helicopter of the Gannett Newspapers to be on hand and assist in the judging. William Kelly, Jr., chairman of finances, has obtained the funds to enable Chester Murphy and Edward Moroch to assemble a galaxy of prizes for the young contestants.

Louis Miller and Nicholas Hemmer are receiving registrations at the offices of the Genesee County Express. John Welch, Sr., assisted by William Guidentfeld, is chief judge of construction. Francis Van Winkle will be chief flight judge, and Richard Appin will be chief scorer. Jake Fries will be the announcer on the public address system. A kite hospital will be set up at the field where William Sullivan and Dennis Nagle will furnish last minute repairs to injured kites.

Joe Malone and Will Simon with the help of Joe Price, will prepare the markings on the field and set up the various equipment needed for the contest. William Appin and his corps of grounds police will keep the cars, the spectators and the contestants in order. Dick Ryan will be the official recorder of the event.

Besides the fifty some prizes to be awarded to individuals the F. Jay Smith Trophy will be given to the Boy Scout Troop which amasses the most points, and the Genesee County Express Award will go to the Girl Scout Troop which wins scores the highest.

### Wind Fells St. John Church Turret



The 15-foot cornice turret from the south side of St. John the Baptist Church, Elmira, lies on the ground after having been toppled in the violent windstorm of Friday of last week. The Rev. Theodore J. Winterroth, pastor, estimated shortly after it fell that replacing the cornice would probably cost \$5,000. Damaged also by the storm was St. Patrick's Church, Elmira.

### Elmira Windstorm Causes Damage To 2 Churches

Severe damage to church property resulted from the windstorm which swept the Elmira area Friday morning of last week.

St. Patrick's Church, Elmira was damaged to the extent of several thousands of dollars, all covered by insurance, according to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William J. Brien, V.F. pastor. A section of the slate roof 20 x 10 feet was ripped off by the storm. Several windows and rain pipes were badly damaged. Similar damage was done at the school and convent across the street.

From the south side of St. John the Baptist Church Elmira a 15-foot cornice turret weighing more than a ton was toppled over.

To replace the fallen turret in its original form will cost between \$3,000 and \$4,000 according to the Rev. Theodore J. Winterroth pastor.

A similar turret on the church's north side was said by witnesses to have swayed back and forth but did not fall.

Father Winterroth was to have the other turret examined to ascertain whether it was weakened during the storm and was in danger of collapsing. Damage to his church was all covered by insurance. Father Winterroth said this week.
